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Message from the President and CEO

Dear Colleagues,

As we prepared this report, we were reminded of the PA profession's tremendous impact on our country's healthcare needs. Although the PA profession's roots are in primary care, the highly regarded reputation of the PA workforce has supported PAs as they ventured into new and different clinical specialties and practice settings. This report shows that PAs work in over 70 medical and surgical specialties and subspecialties. We provide detailed information on 24 disciplines PAs most often chose to practice in 2020, including the three newly added specialties—critical care medicine, geriatrics, and plastic surgery. The Certified PA profession grew 28.6% from 2016-2020, and the report depicts the growth of each specialty during that timeframe. Of the specialties that were included in 2016, Psychiatry has experienced the most considerable growth at 57.1% during those five years. It is rewarding to know that our profession contributes so significantly to helping address the country's mental health needs—especially during the challenging times we are all experiencing.



It's interesting to look at the demographics of PAs who choose to work in various specialties. For example, obstetrics/gynecology and plastic surgery are largely comprised of females, 97.7% and 90.5%, respectively. While still predominantly female, orthopaedic surgery and occupational medicine have higher proportions of males, 47.7% and 43.6%, respectively. The most diverse specialty, general internal medicine, with 8.7% Hispanic/Latino, 7.2% Asian, and 5.8% African American, highlights that progress is still very much needed. PAs working in occupational medicine have the highest median age (48) and the highest proportion of PAs planning for upcoming retirement (15.5% plan to retire within five years).

This year's report also includes information on the use of telemedicine, burnout, job satisfaction, and supply and demand. Although we don't have the full profession's response to these new questions, since these topics are so timely, data by specialty is provided in the Appendix. Even after dealing with the tragedies of the pandemic, 73.4% of PAs reported having no symptoms of burnout, and 72.9% are completely or mostly satisfied with their present job. This is a testament to the resilience and dedication of Certified PAs.

Lastly, we are pleased to provide a new accompanying report, the 2020 Specialty Supplement Report on Secondary Specialty. Slightly over 12,000 PAs work in secondary clinical positions, and the new supplement report offers information on where PAs are practicing in their secondary position. This information helps to more completely quantify and depict the contributions of the PA profession.

We are always grateful to the dedicated Certified PAs who make these reports possible by taking the time to complete and update their PA Professional Profile data, and we hope you will find these reports interesting and valuable.

About the Data and Collection Methodology

Introduction

Since certifying the first physician assistants (PAs) in 1975, NCCPA has collected data on the PA profession as PAs completed various processes related to obtaining initial certification and then maintaining certification by earning and logging continuing medical education credits and passing recertification examinations. In May 2012, NCCPA's data gathering efforts were significantly enhanced with the launch of the PA Professional Profile. This data gathering instrument is presented to PAs through a secure portal within NCCPA's website. The Profile was launched with two modules: "About Me" and "My Practice."

In December 2012, NCCPA added a "Recently Certified" module delivered online to PAs who have been certified for less than six months. Data from that module can be found in another report (2019 Statistical Profile of Recently Certified Physician Assistants) first published in 2014 and updated annually.

Data Editing and Analysis

Data reflected in this report include responses from PAs who were certified as of December 31, 2020 and have made updates to their Profile between January 1, 2018 and December 31, 2020. Data from 2016 has been included to provide five-year comparisons. In addition, some data were obtained from other NCCPA data collection strategies. As of December 31, 2020, there were 148,560 Certified PAs, and 127,560 provided responses for at least a portion of the Profile, yielding an overall response rate of 85.9%. In 2020 new questions were added to the Profile. Those data can be found in the appendix. The response rate for the new items is 42.7% as of December 31, 2020. As more PAs access their Profile and provide responses to these newly added questions, it is anticipated that response rates on these items will be similar to the current overall response rate, and data from these items will be moved from the appendix to the body of the report in future years.

Responses were examined for consistency and potential errors. In cases of obvious error or inconclusive data, the responses were not included in the analysis. The number of responses to individual items varies due to differing response rates or due to the data being removed for reasons previously noted. Rate per 1,000 physicians is derived from the Association of American Medical Colleges' 2019 Physician Specialty Data Report. Analyses of the data consist primarily of descriptive statistics.

About NCCPA

NCCPA is the only certifying organization for PAs in the United States. Established as a not-for-profit organization in 1974, NCCPA is dedicated to providing certification programs that reflect standards for clinical knowledge, clinical reasoning and other medical skills and professional behaviors required upon entry into practice and throughout the careers of PAs. All U.S. states, the District of Columbia and the U.S. territories have decided to rely on NCCPA certification as one of the criteria for initial licensure or regulation of PAs. More than 175,000 PAs have been certified by NCCPA since 1975.

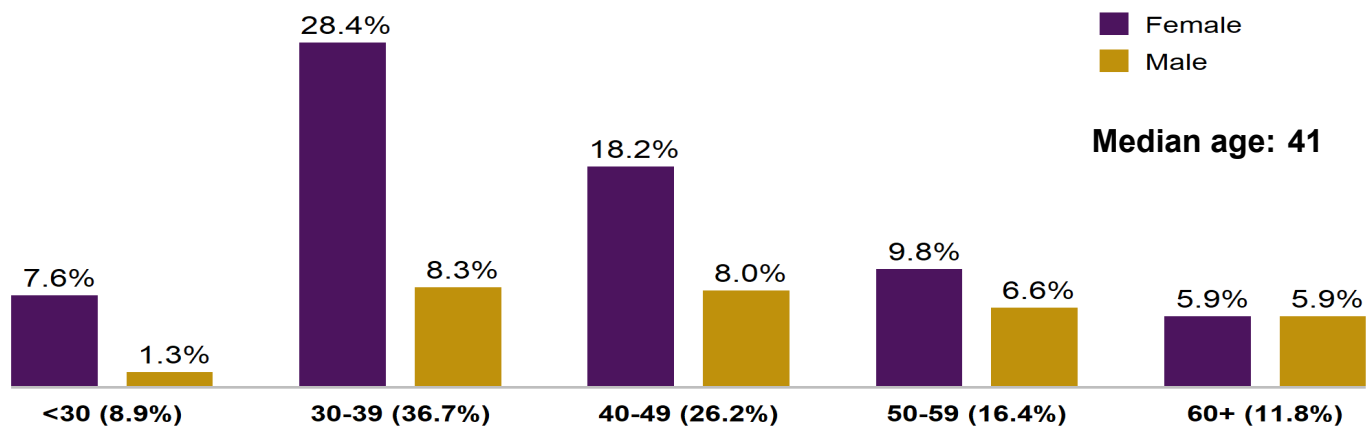

Distribution of Certified Primary Care PAs by Gender and Age

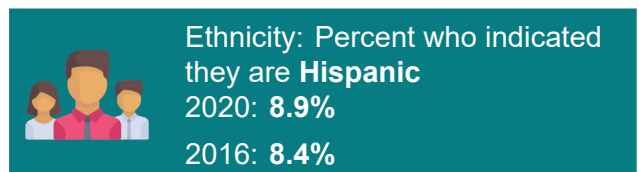

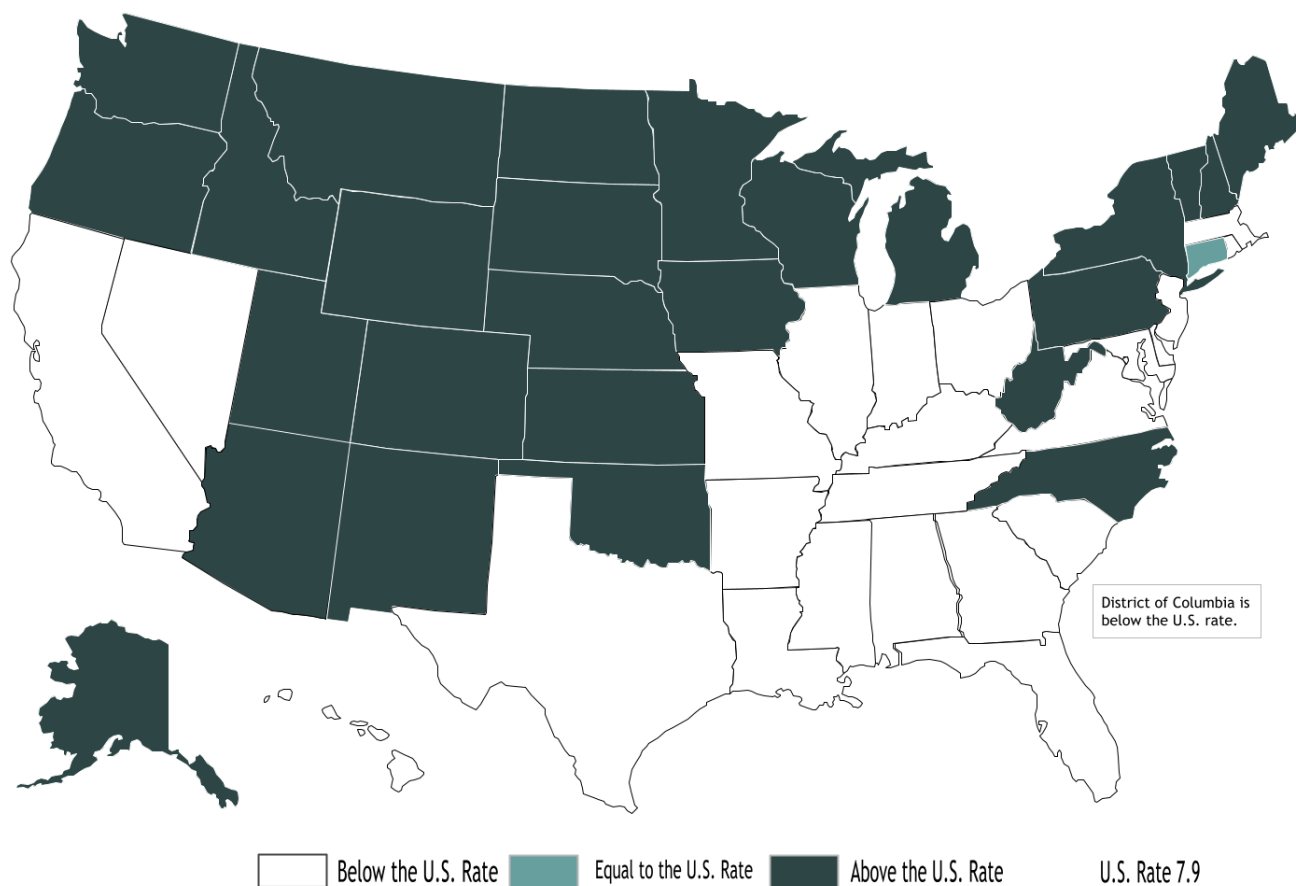
Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

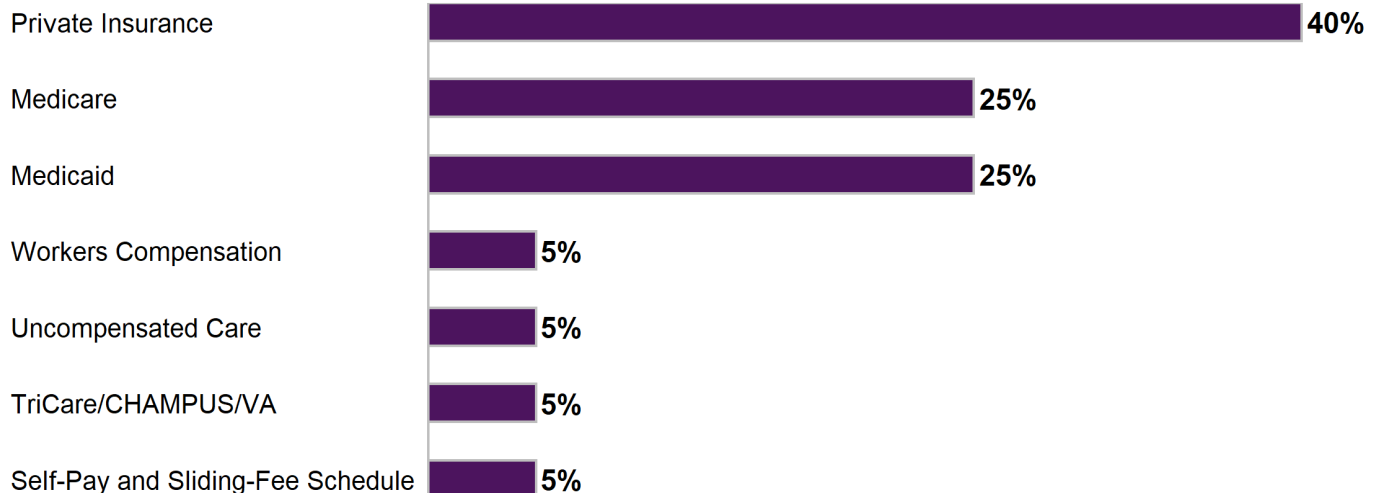

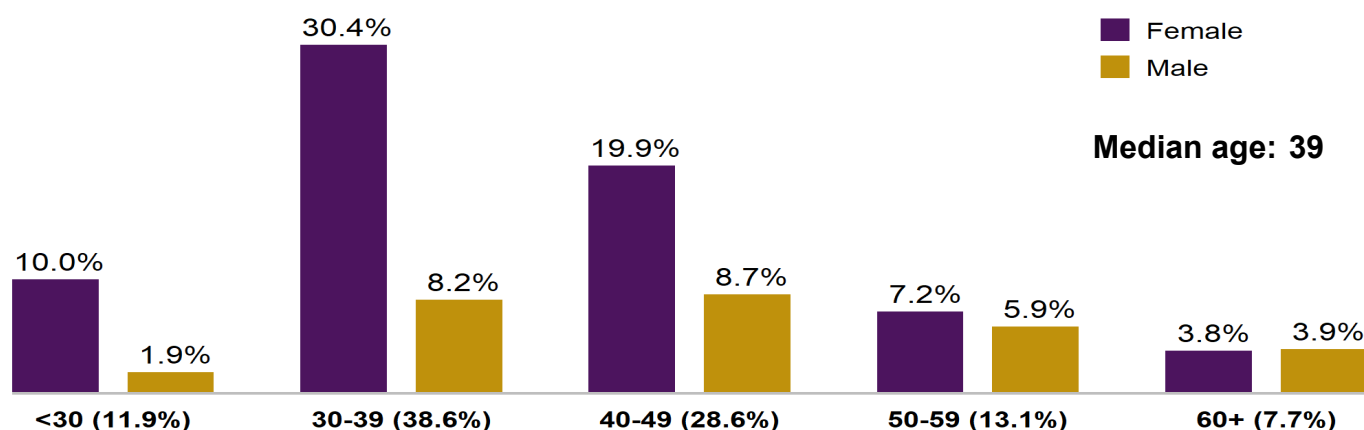

Distribution of Certified Cardiology PAs by Gender and Age

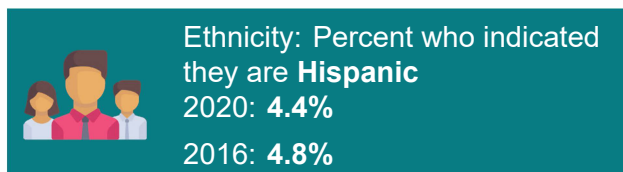

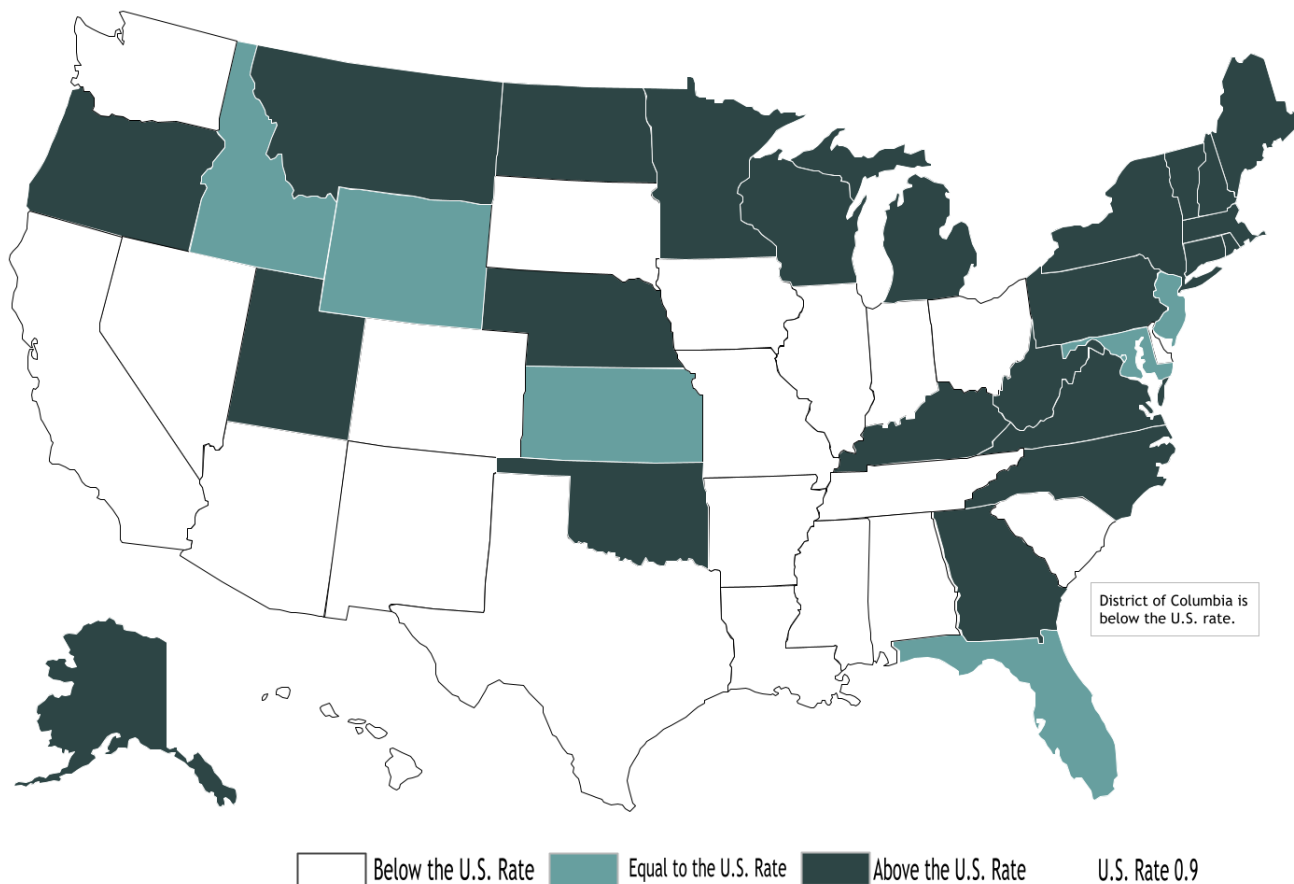
Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

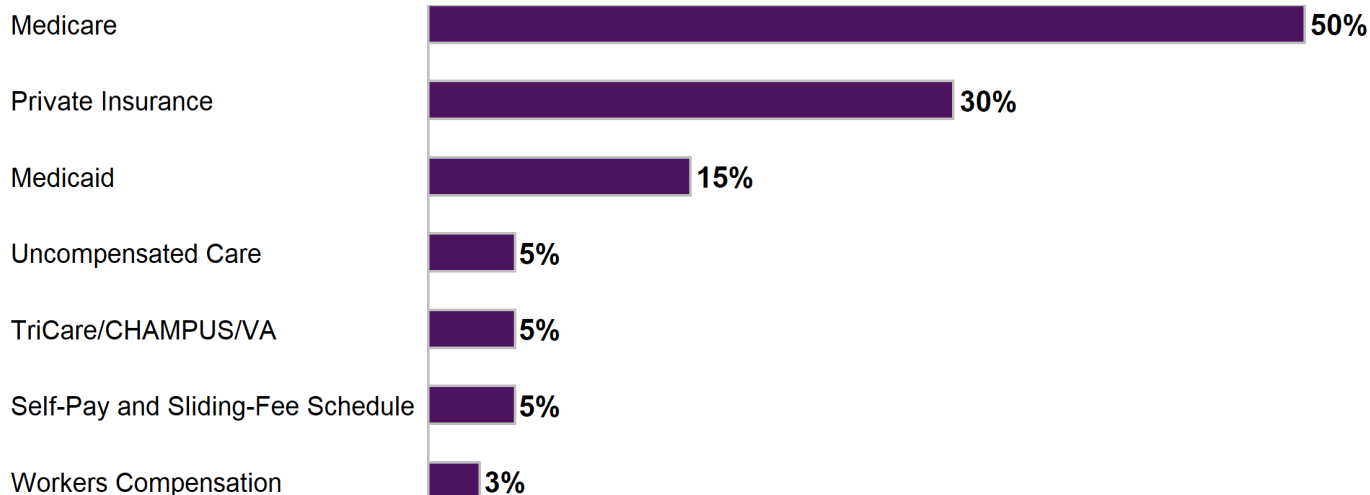

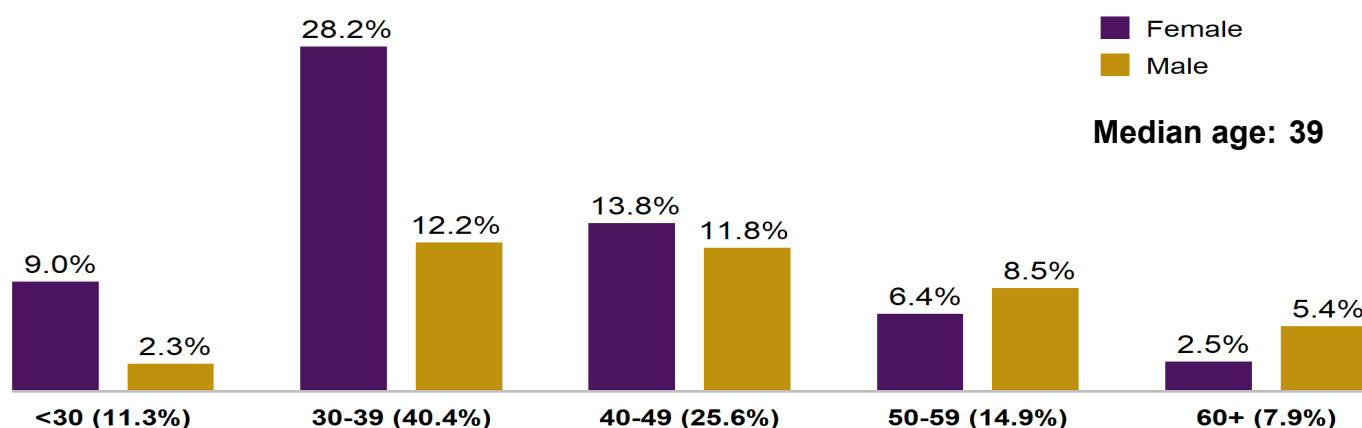

Distribution of Certified Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery PAs by Gender and Age

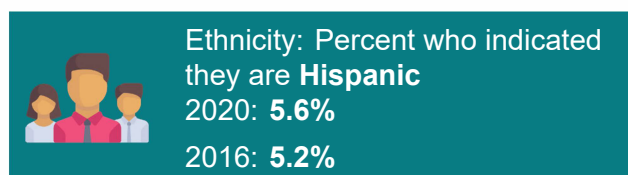

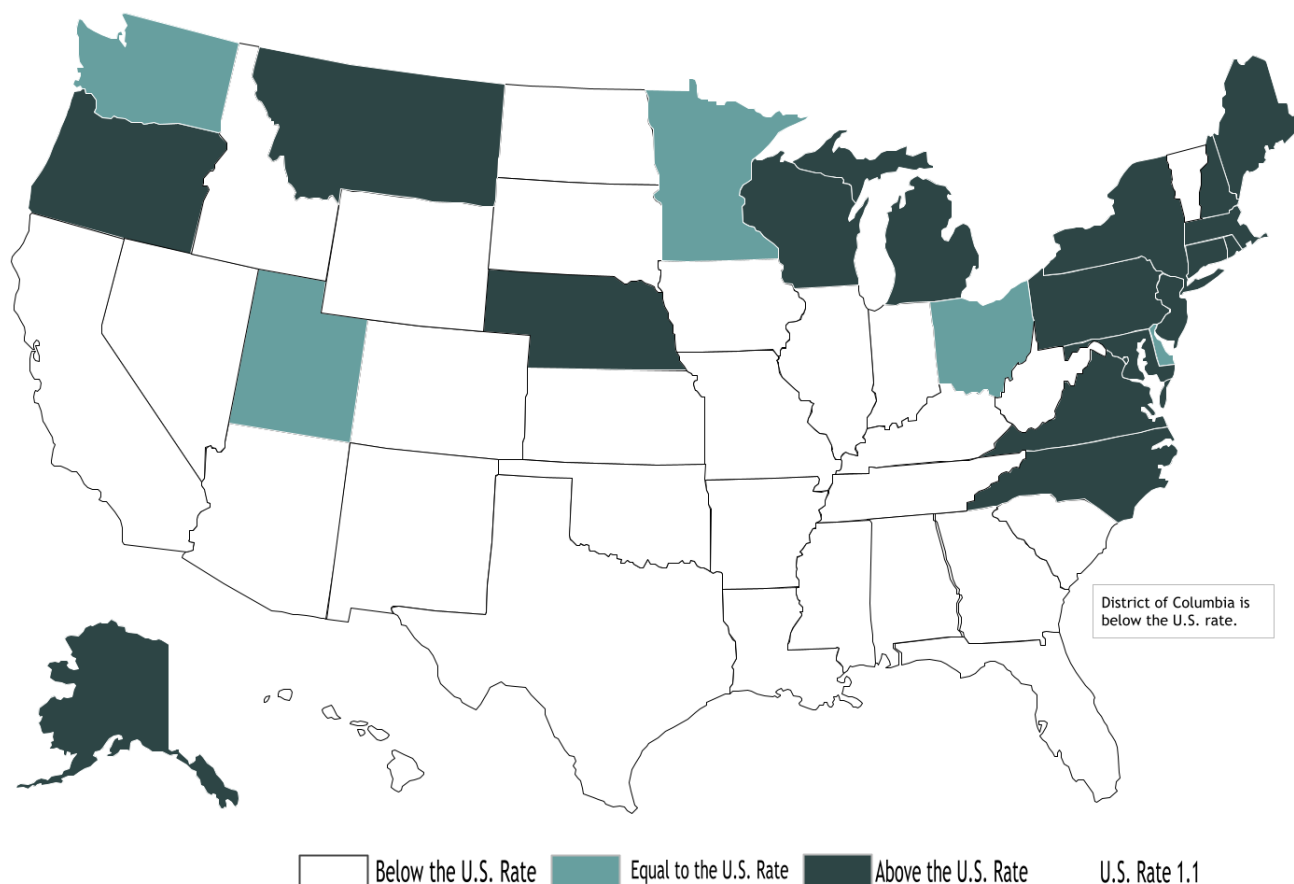

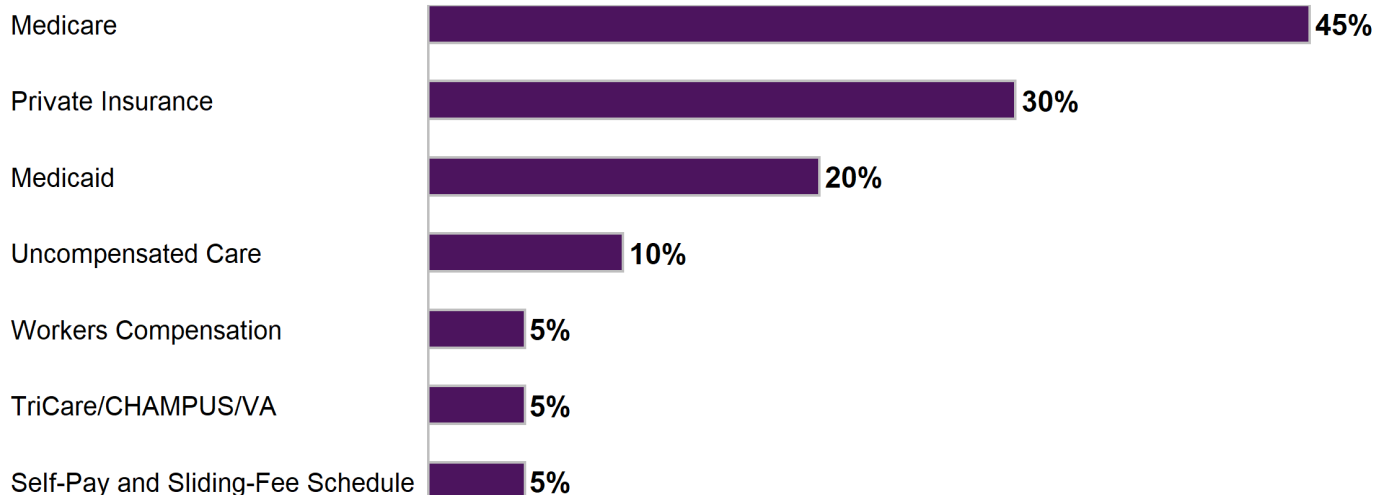

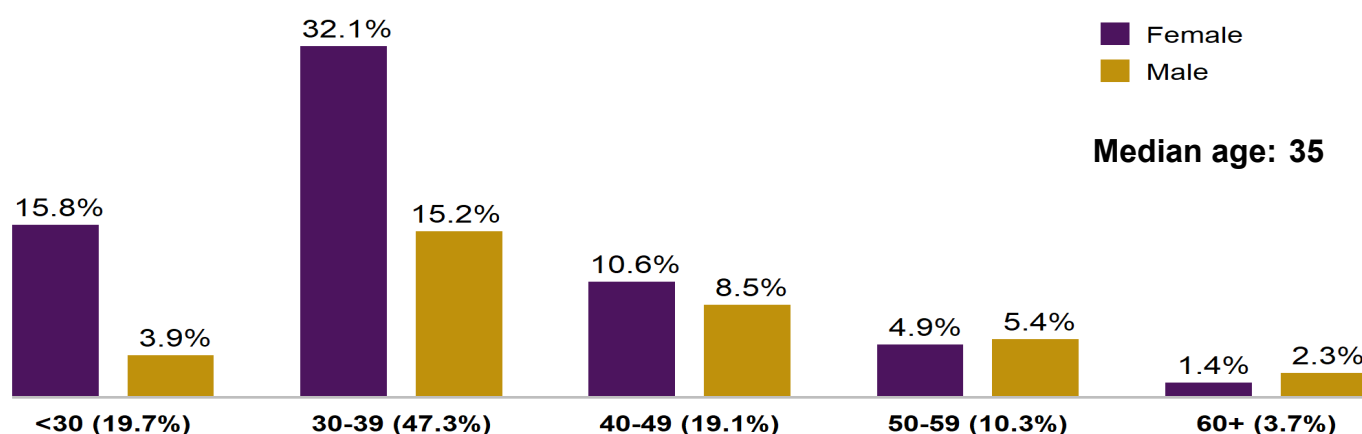

Distribution of Certified Cardiology PAs by Gender and Age

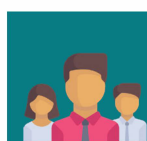

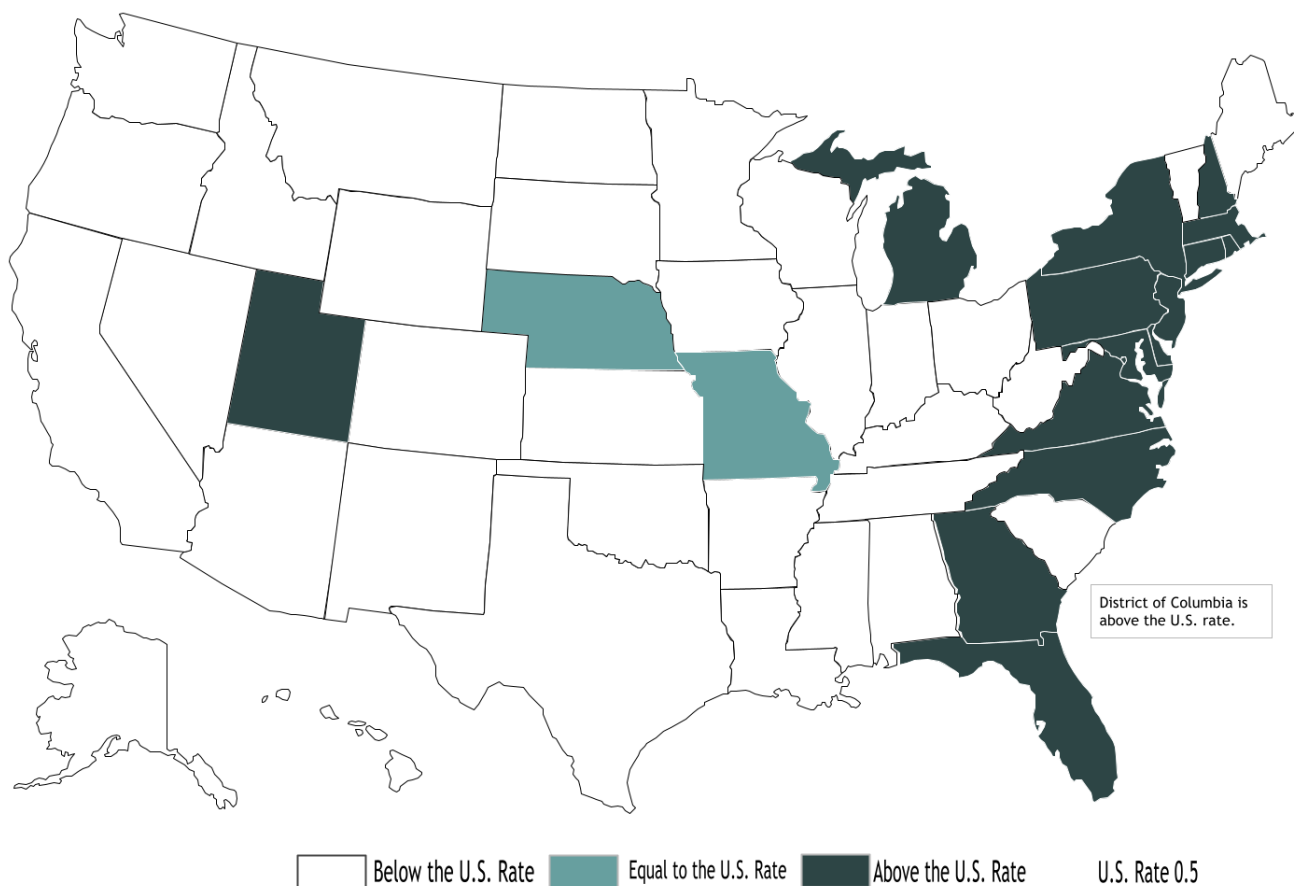

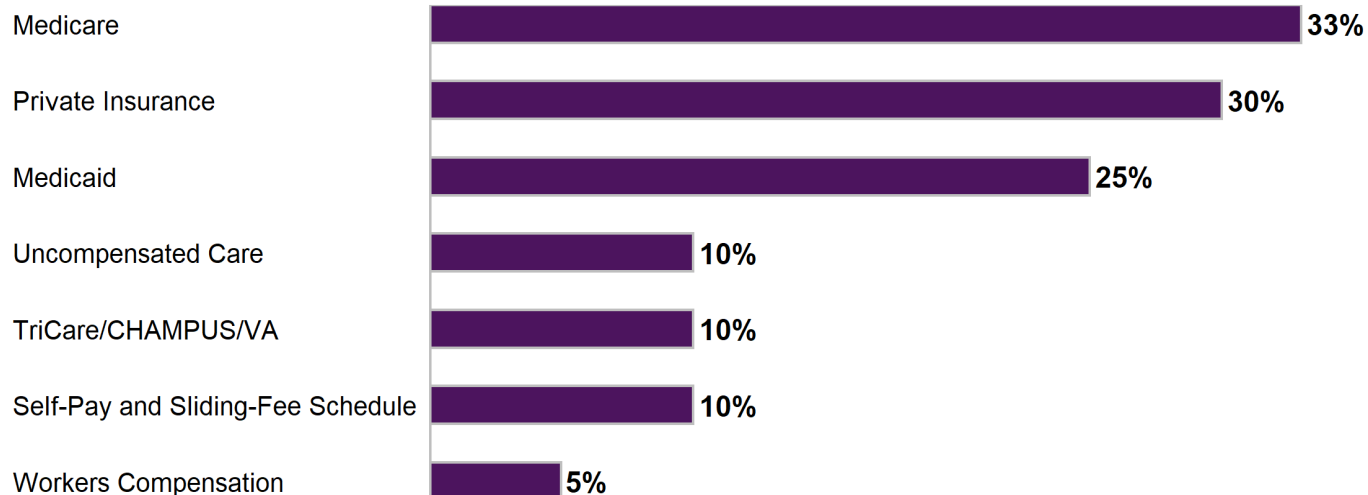

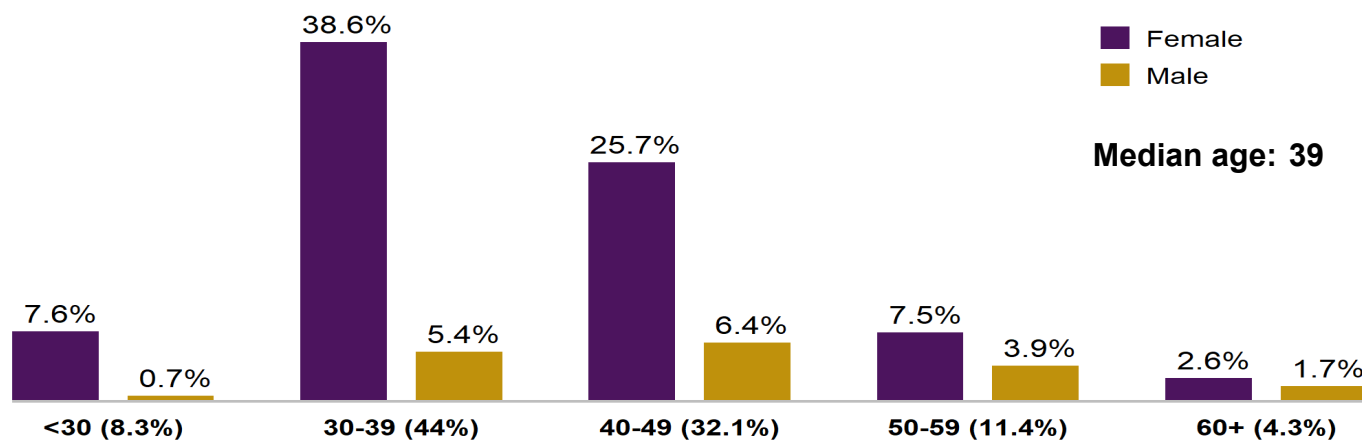

Distribution of Certified Dermatology PAs by Gender and Age

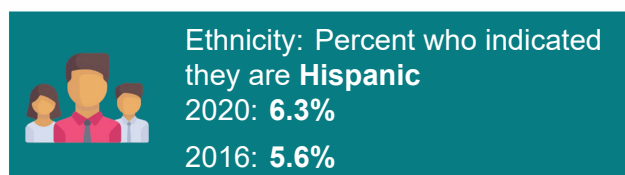

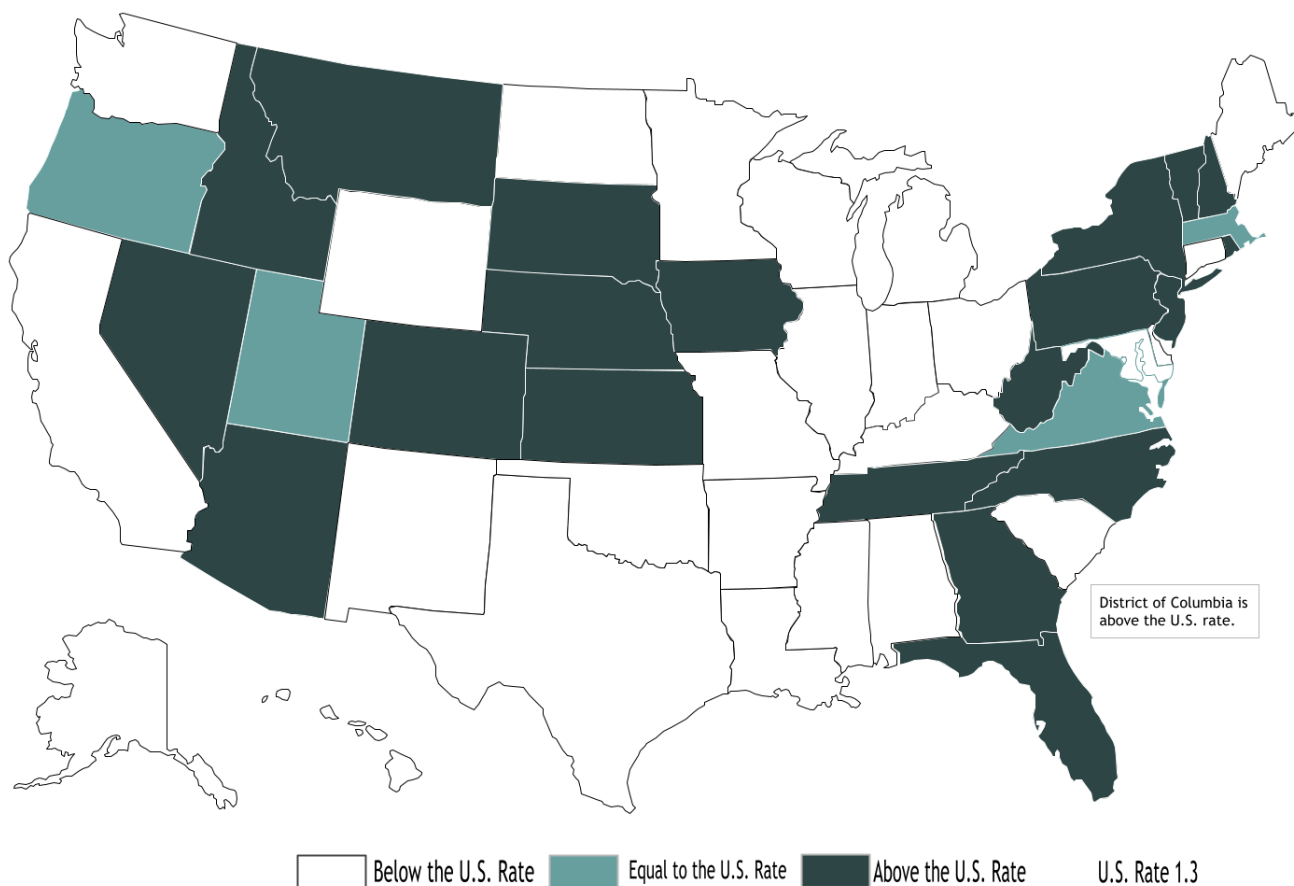

Distribution of Certified Emergency Medicine PAs by Gender and Age

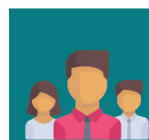

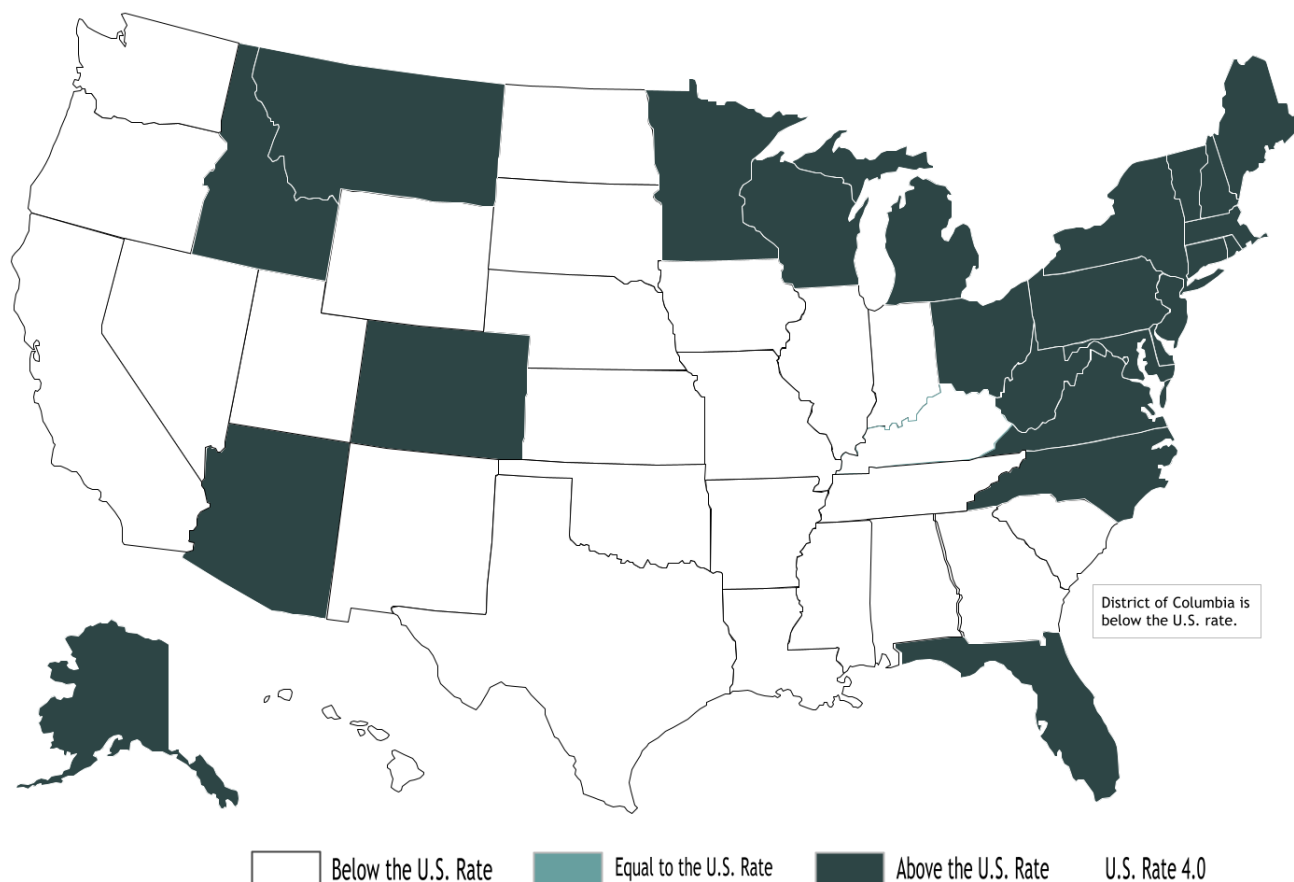

Distribution of Certified Family Medicine/General Practice PAs by Gender and Age

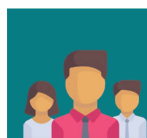

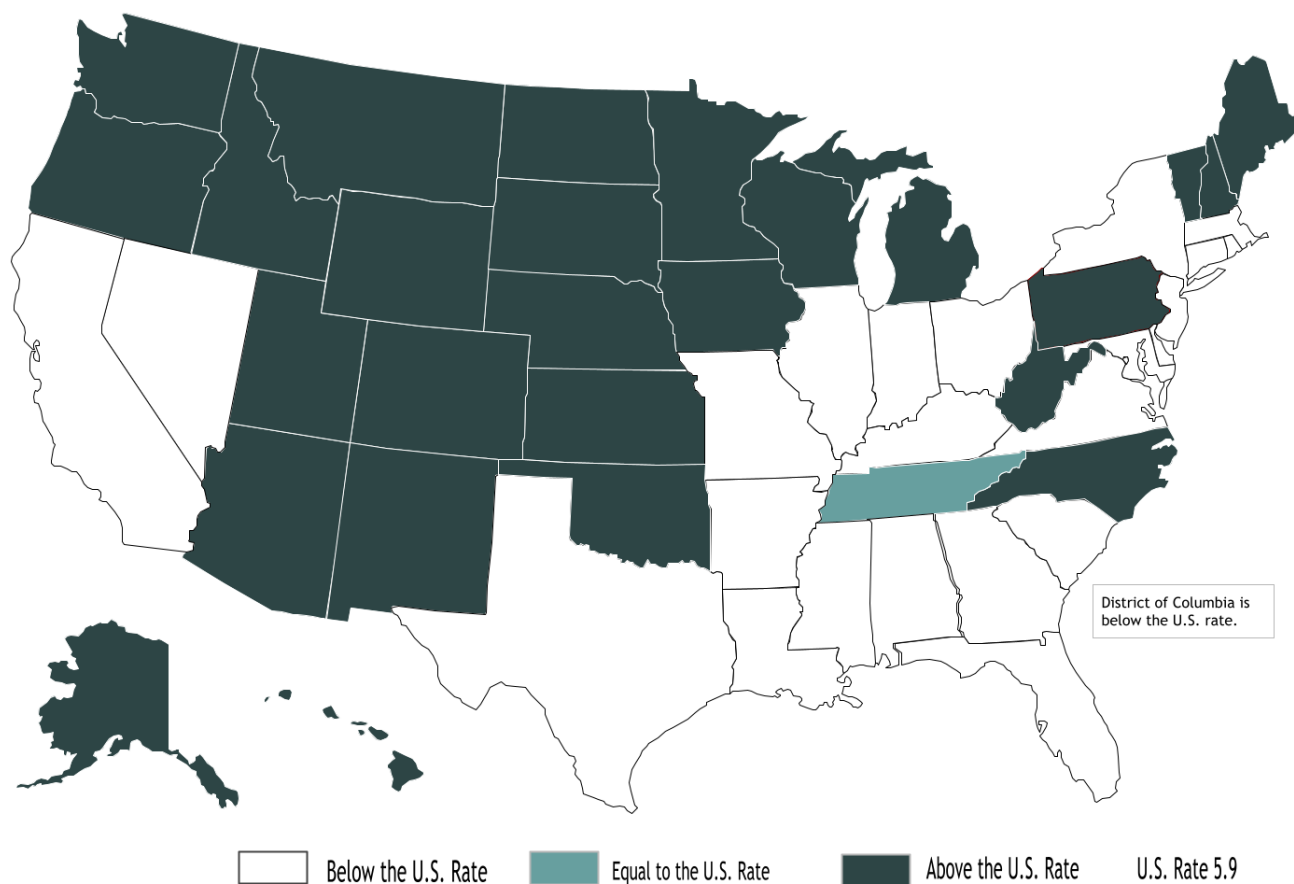

Distribution of Certified Gastroenterology PAs by Gender and Age

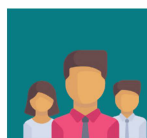

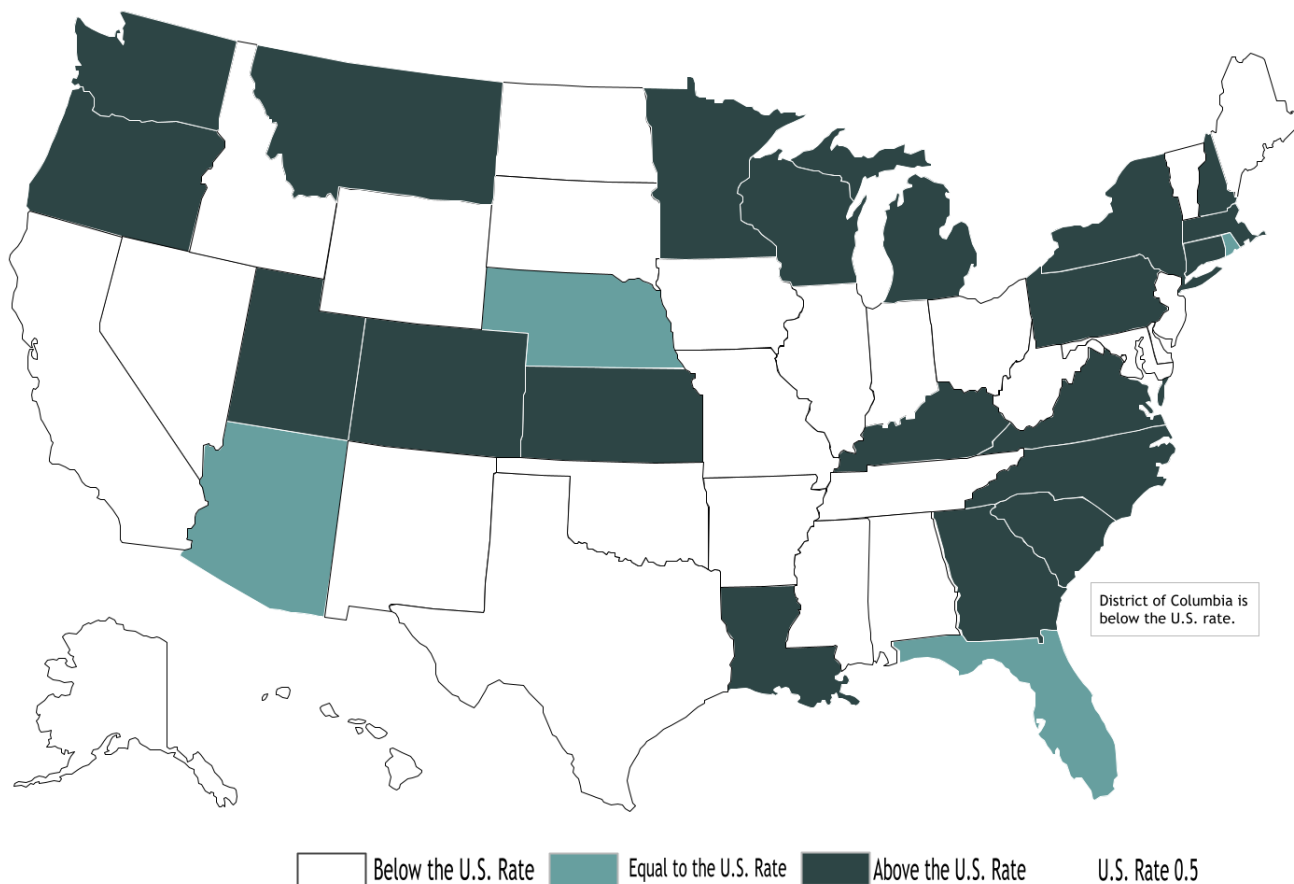

Distribution of Certified General Surgery PAs by Gender and Age

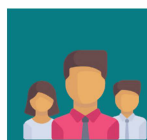

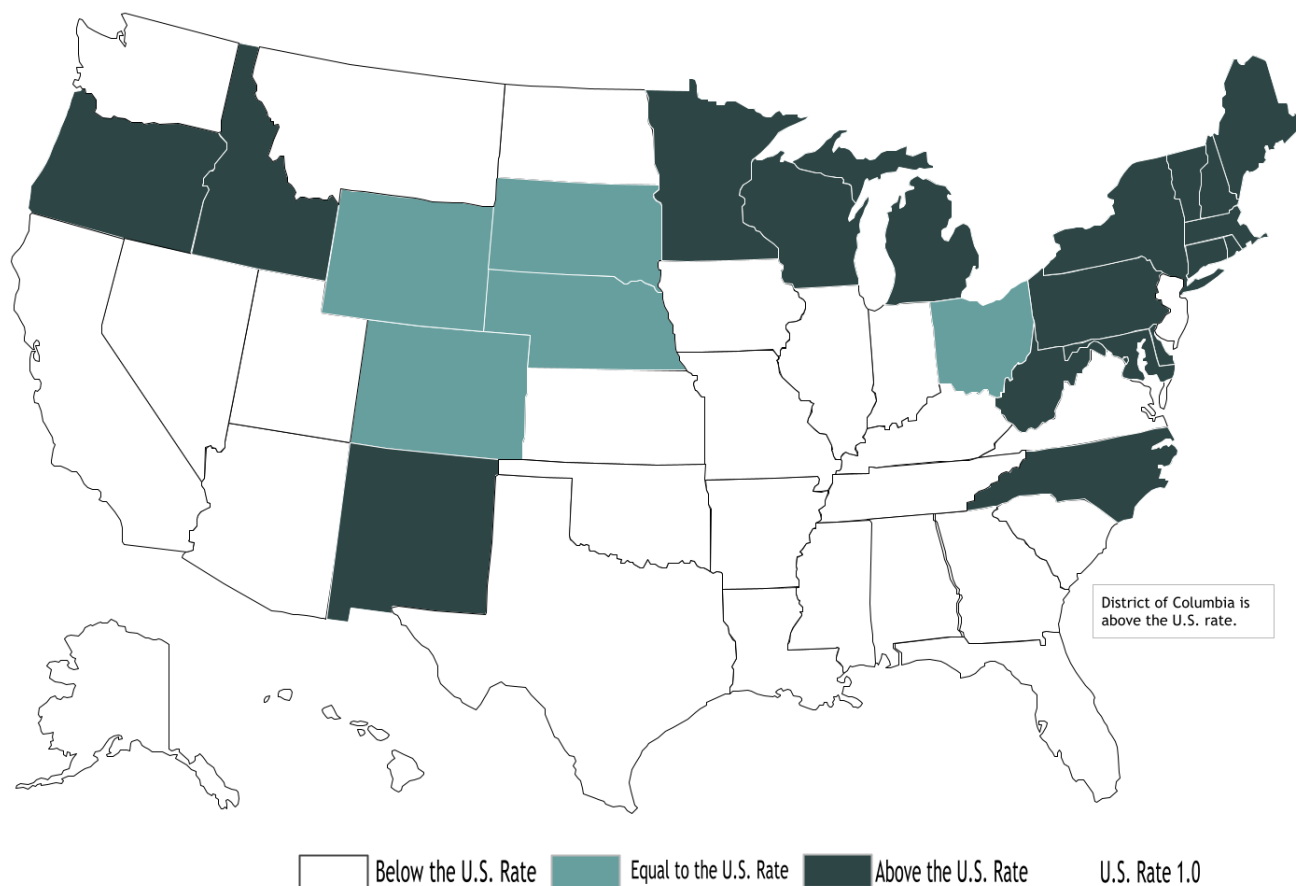

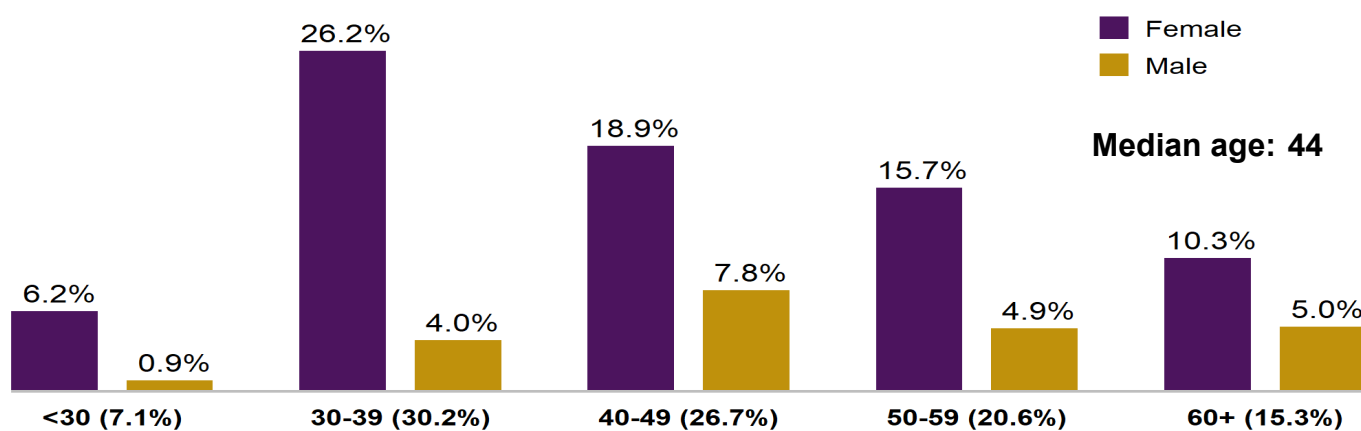

Distribution of Certified Cardiology PAs by Gender and Age

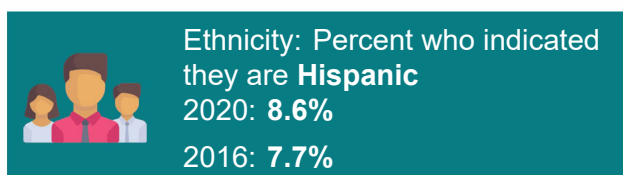

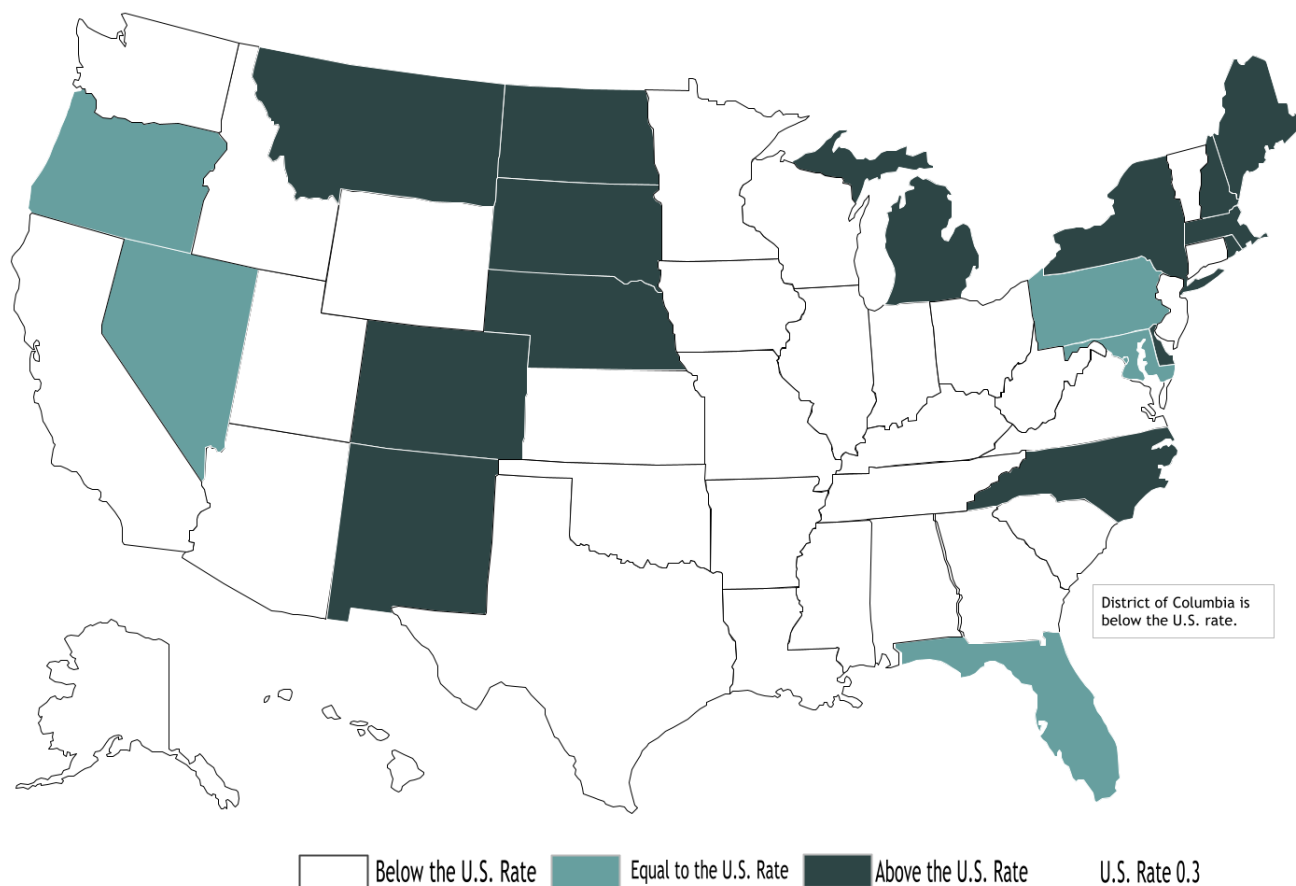

Distribution of Certified Hospital Medicine PAs by Gender and Age

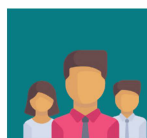

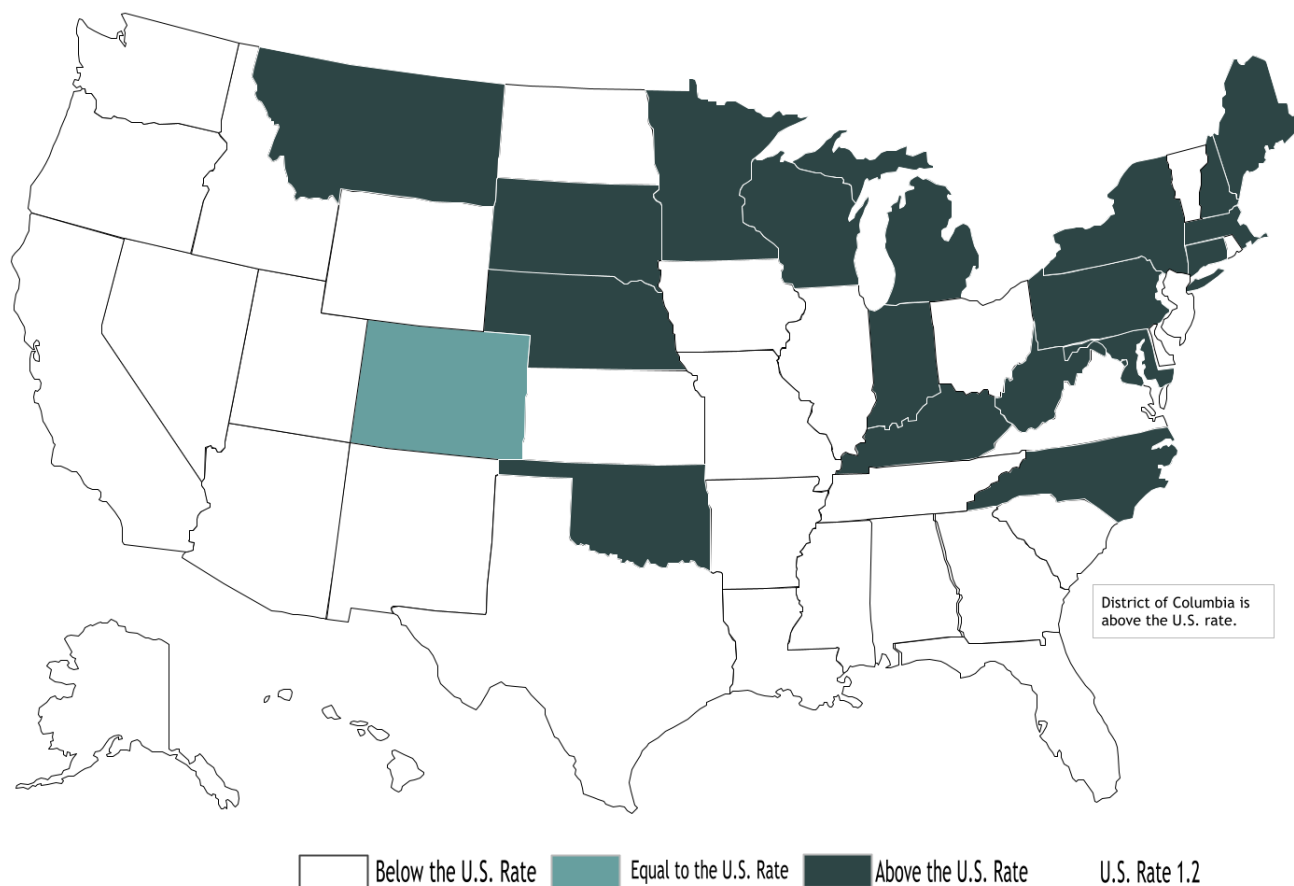

Distribution of Certified Internal Medicine - General PAs by Gender and Age

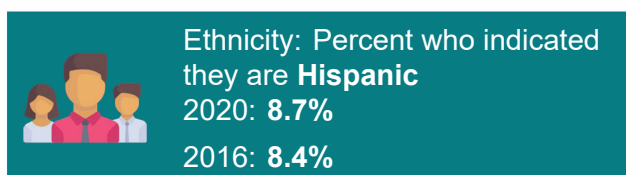

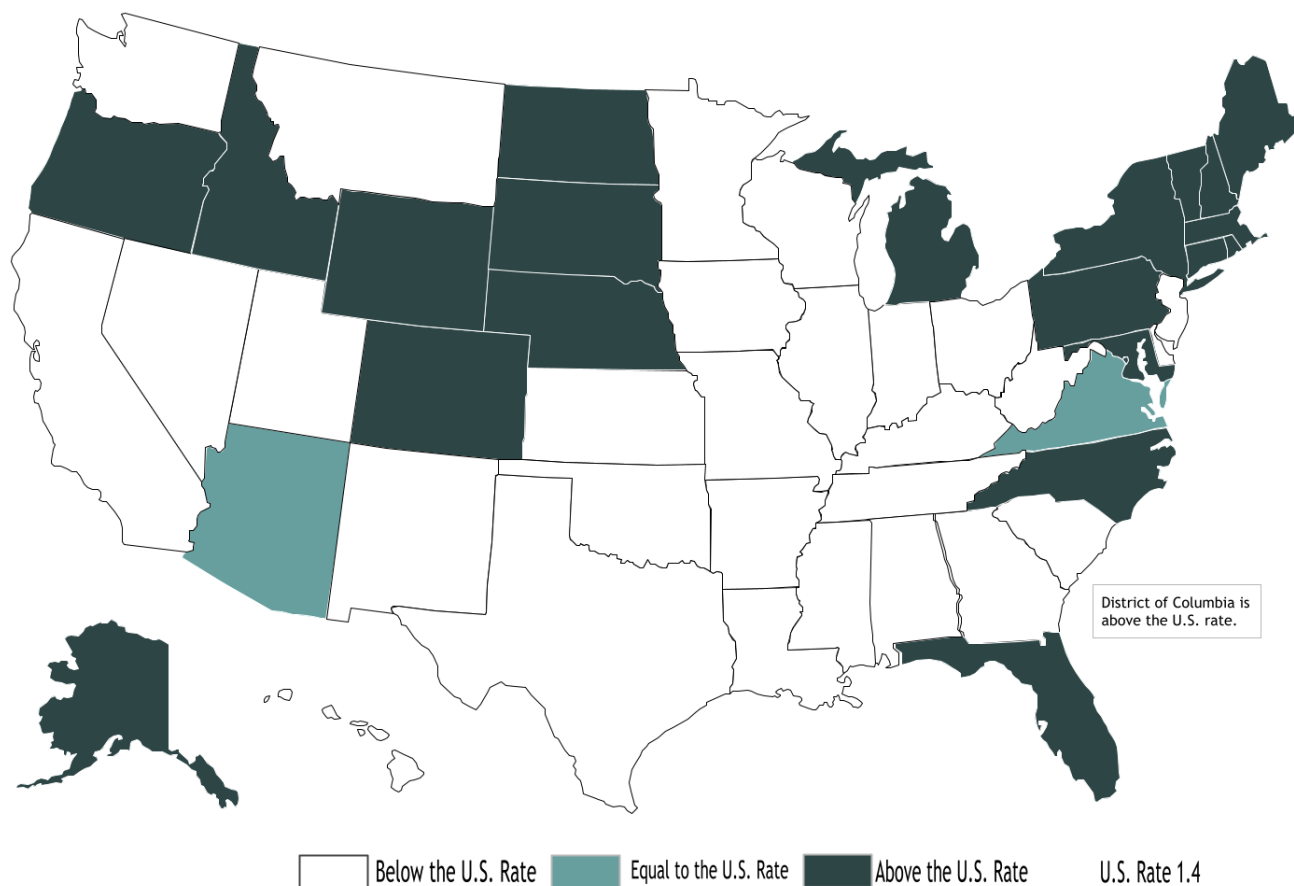

Distribution of Certified Neurology PAs by Gender and Age

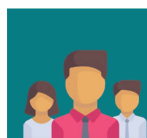

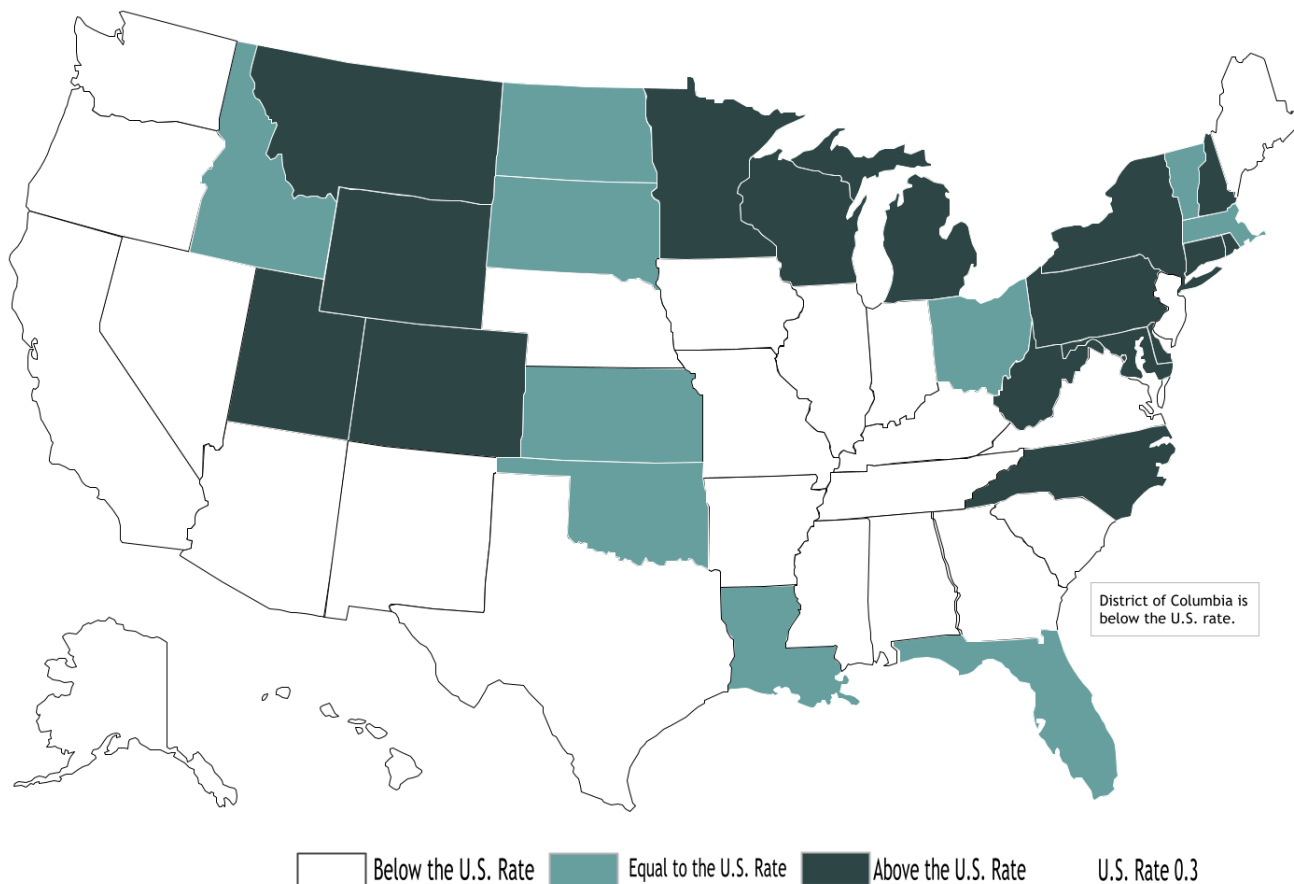

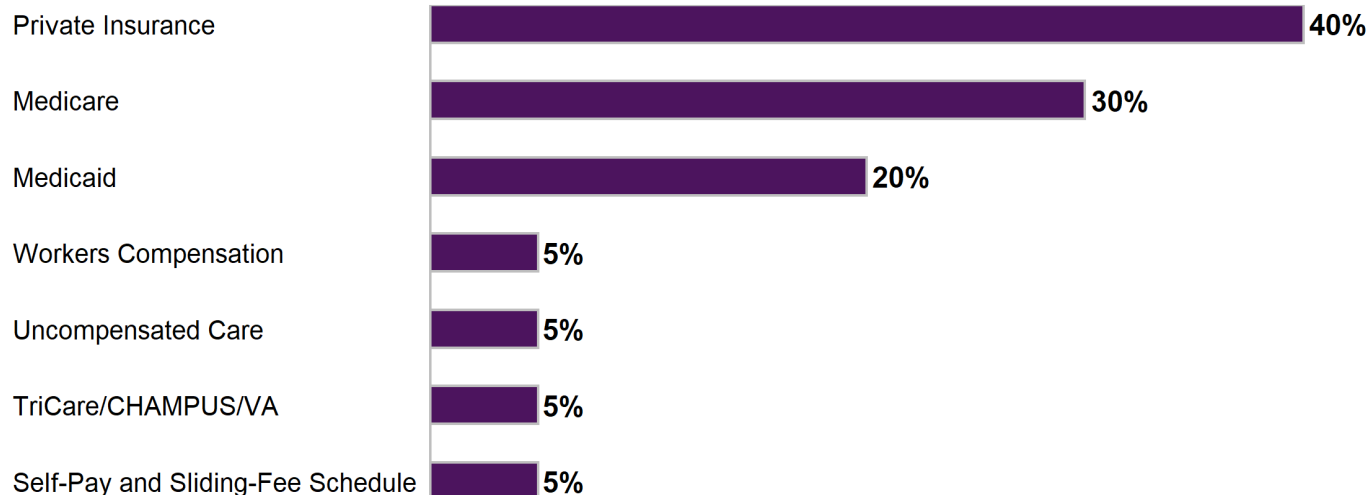

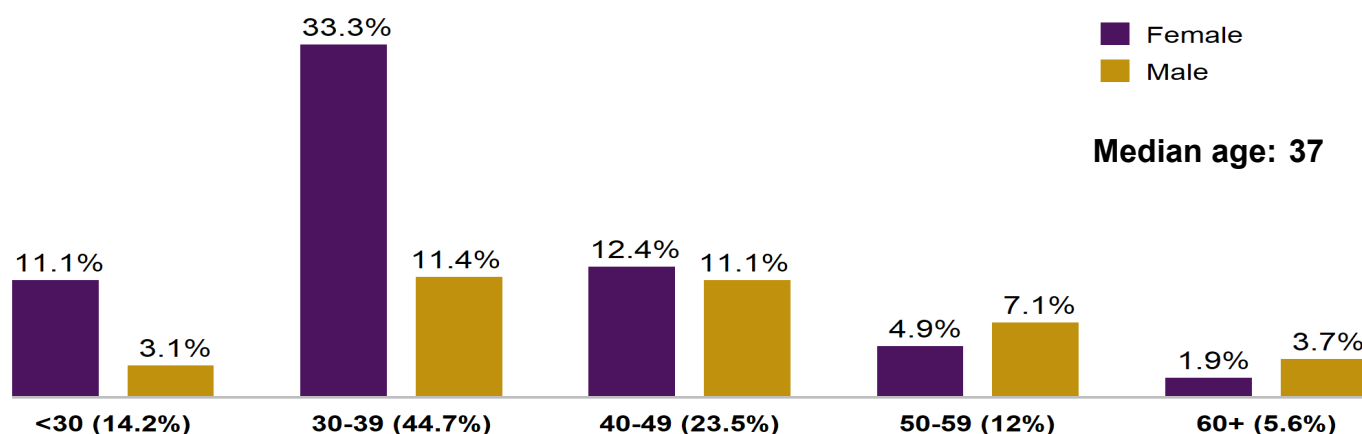

Distribution of Certified Neurosurgery PAs by Gender and Age

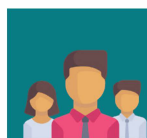

Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

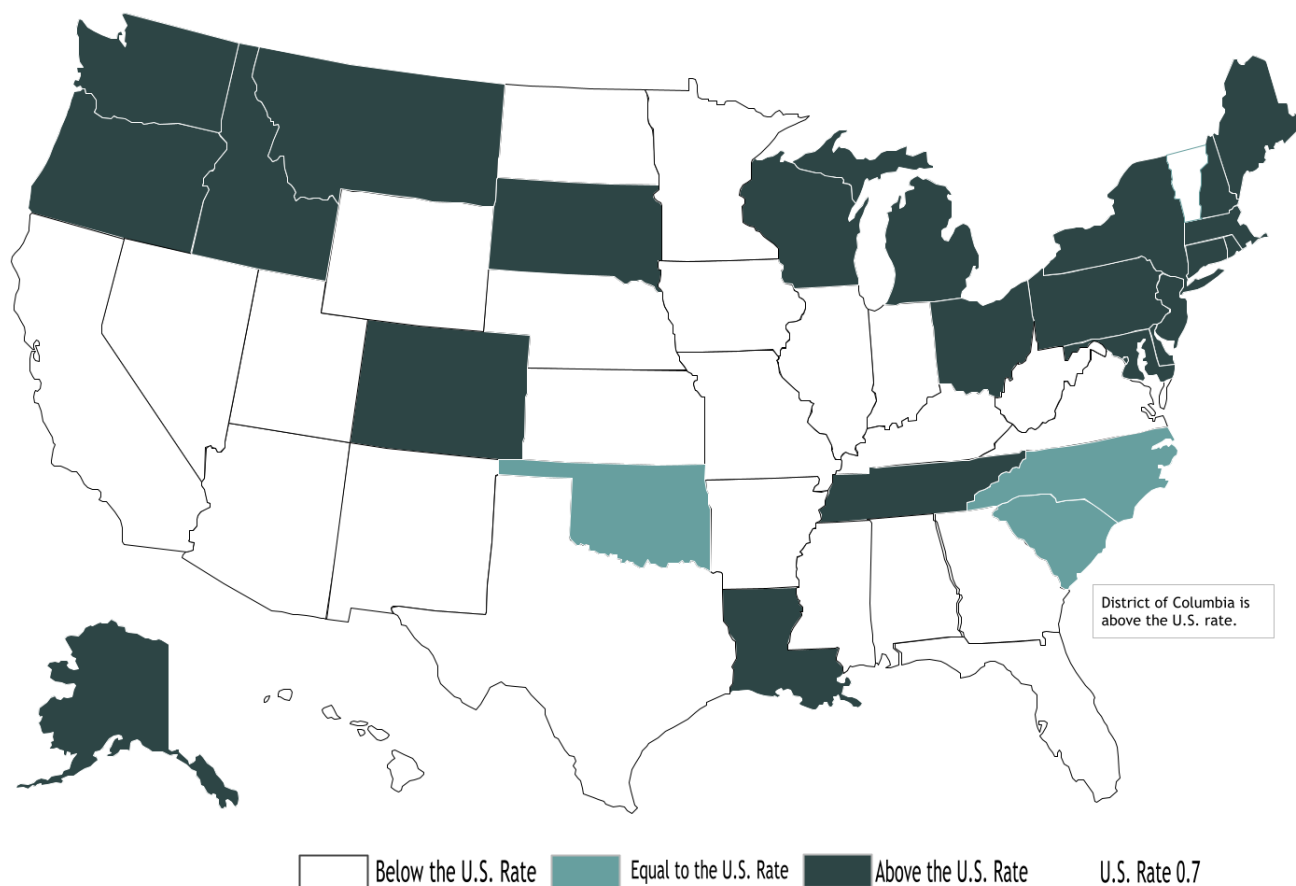

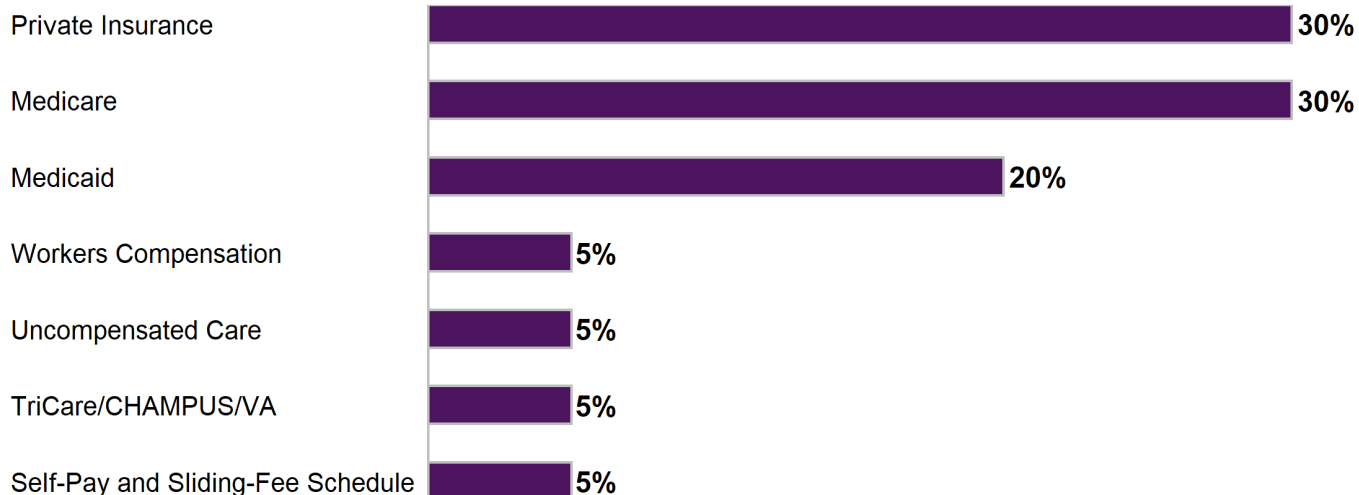

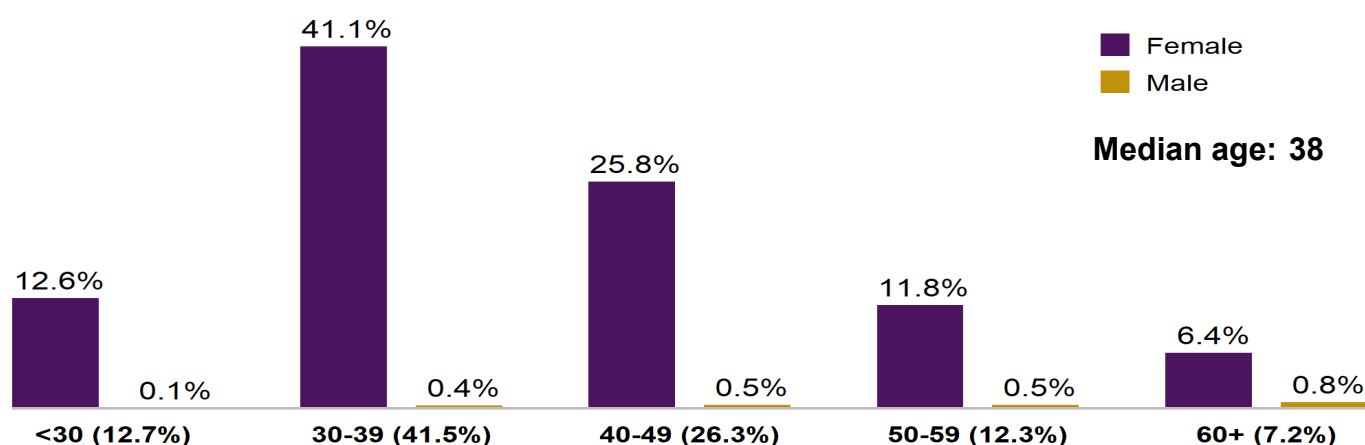

Distribution of Certified Obstetrics and Gynecology PAs by Gender and Age

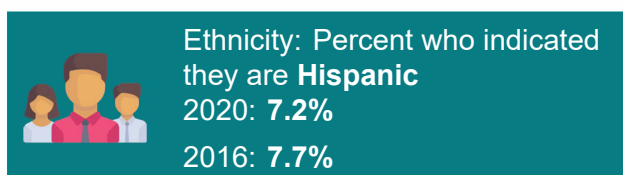

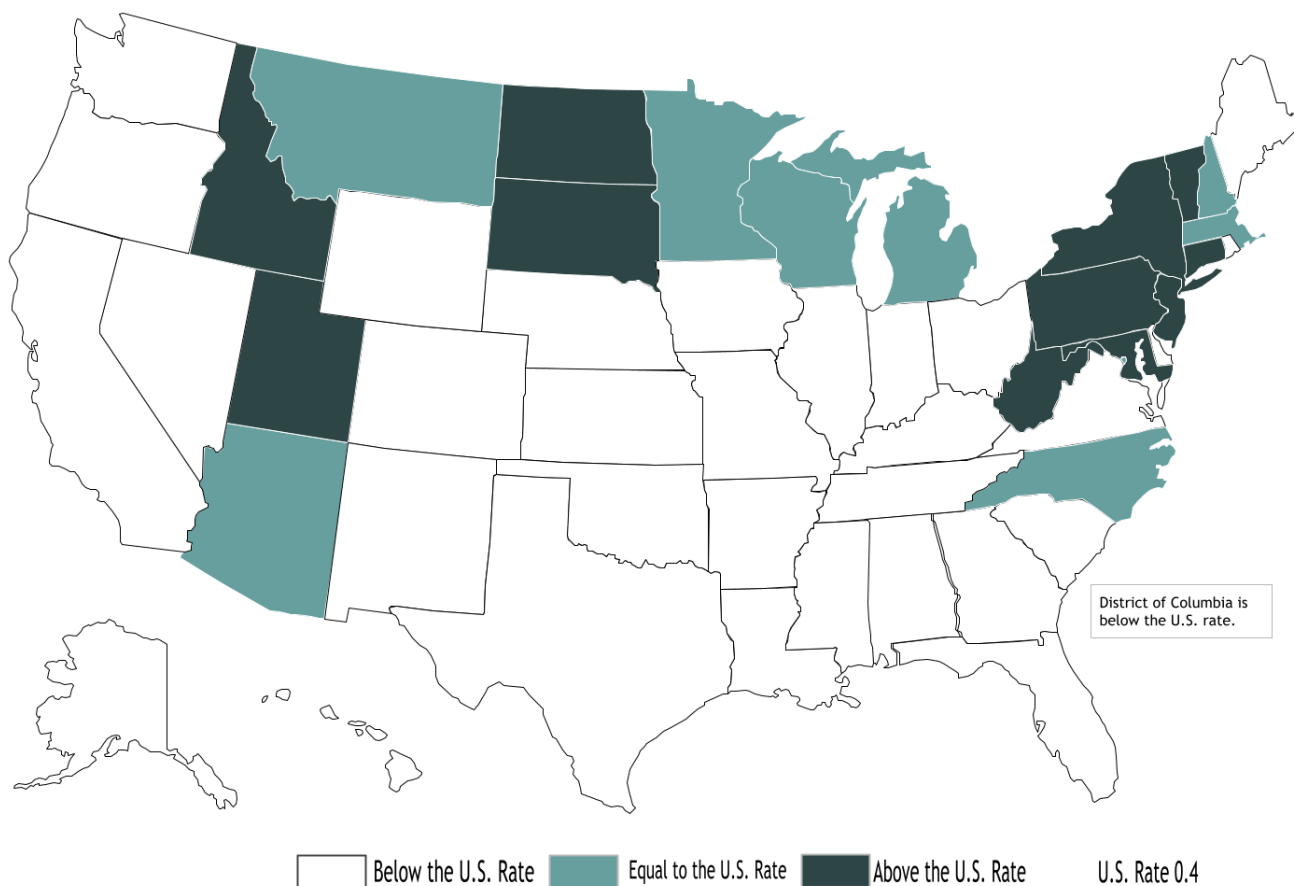

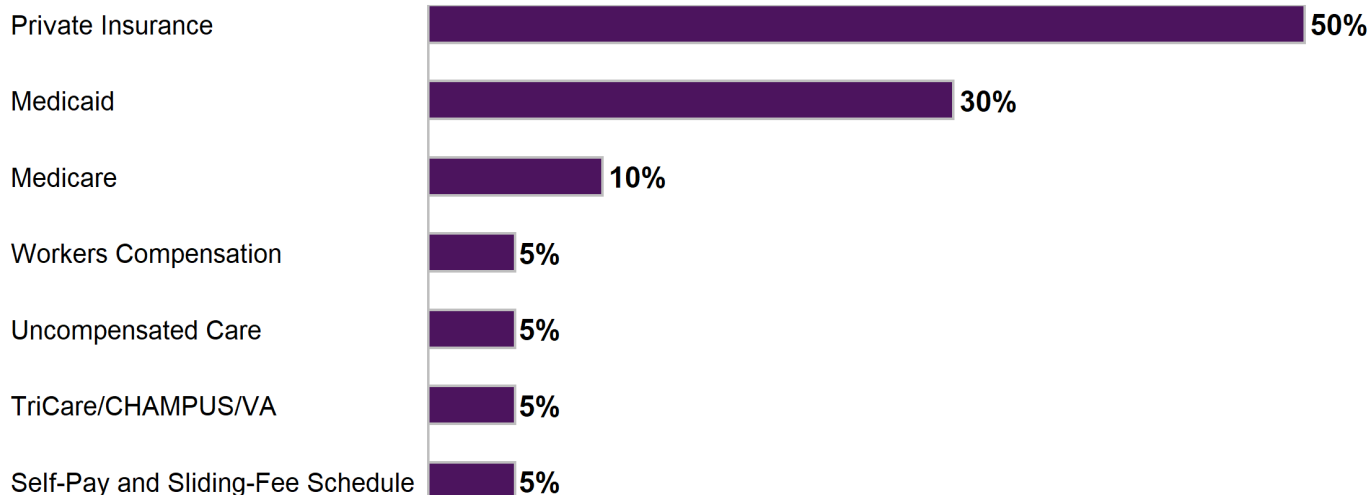

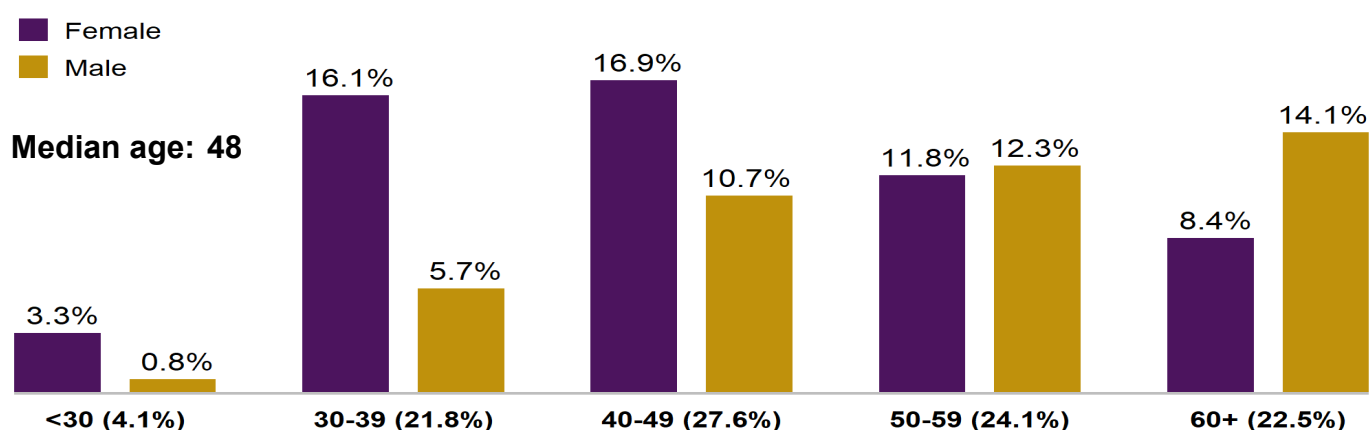

Distribution of Certified Occupational Medicine PAs by Gender and Age

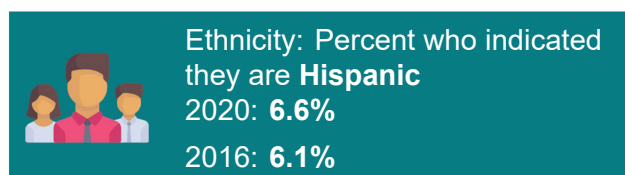

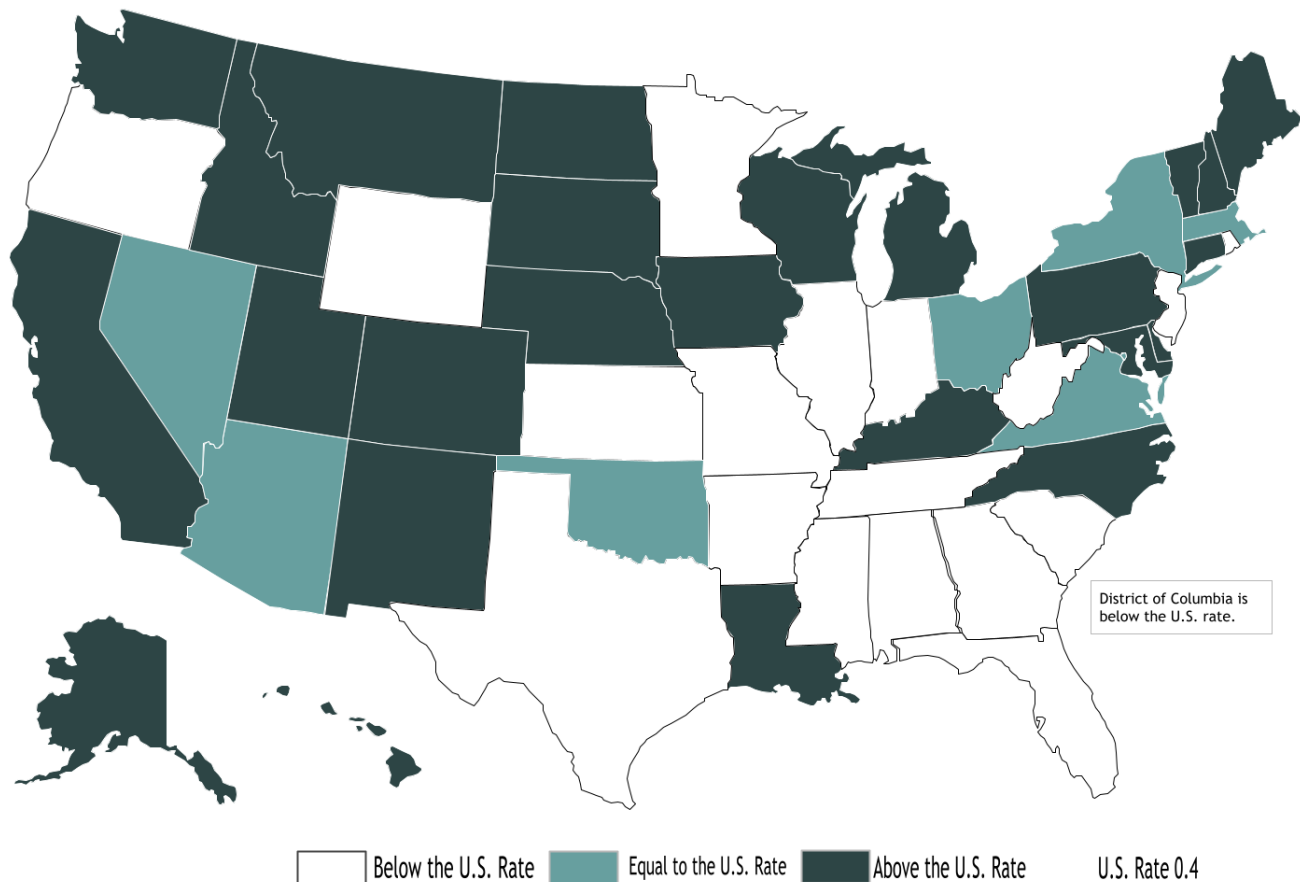

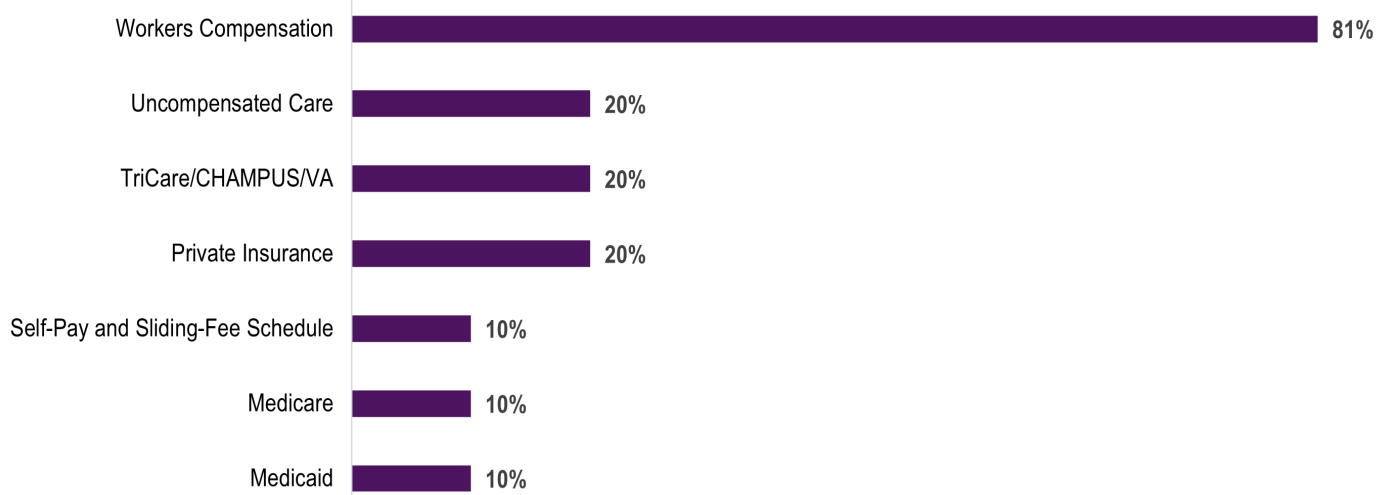

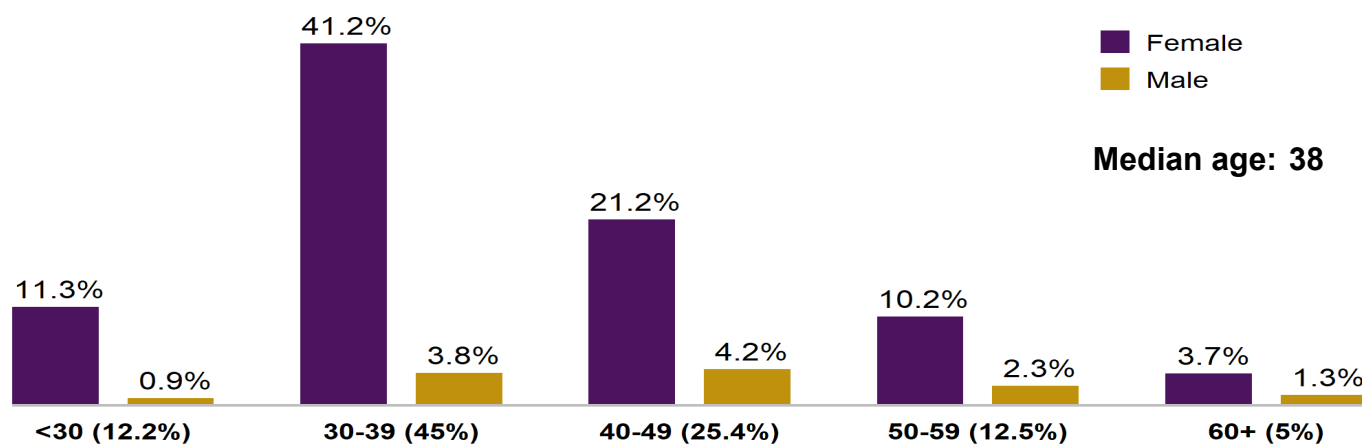

Distribution of Certified Oncology PAs by Gender and Age

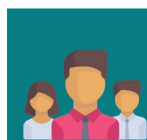

Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

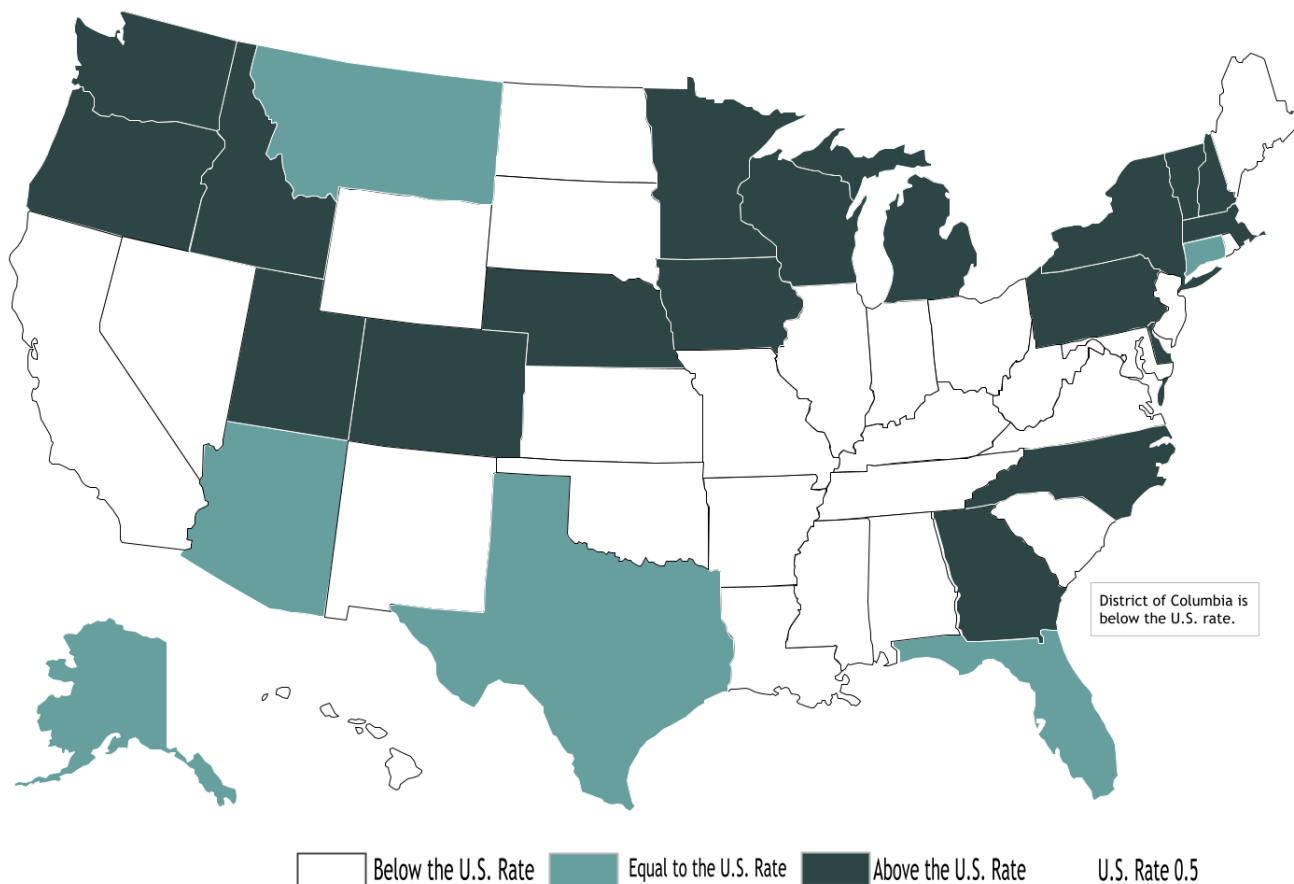

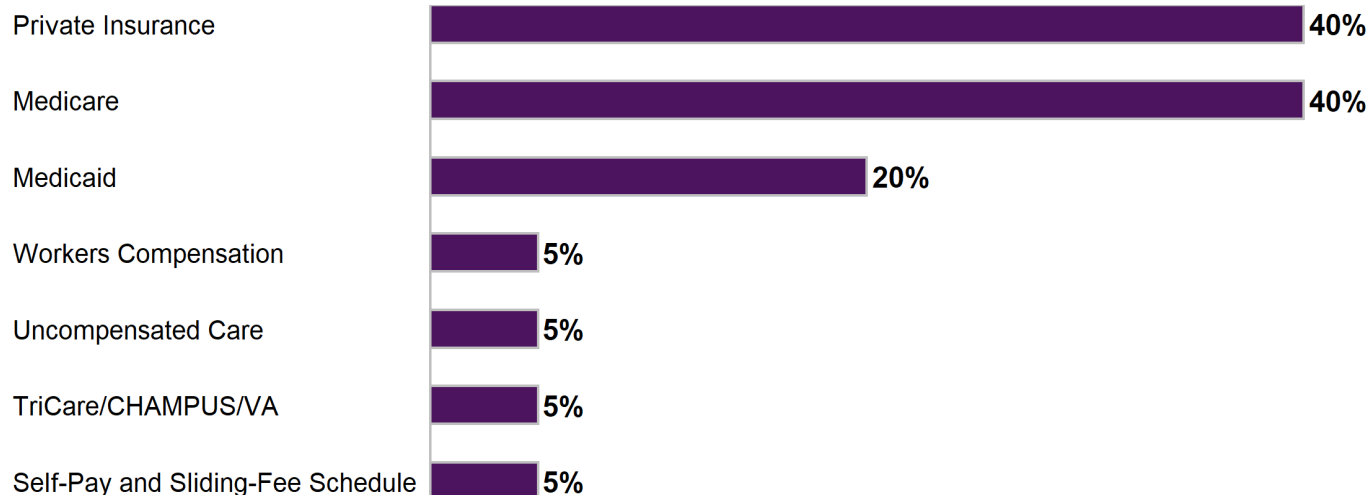

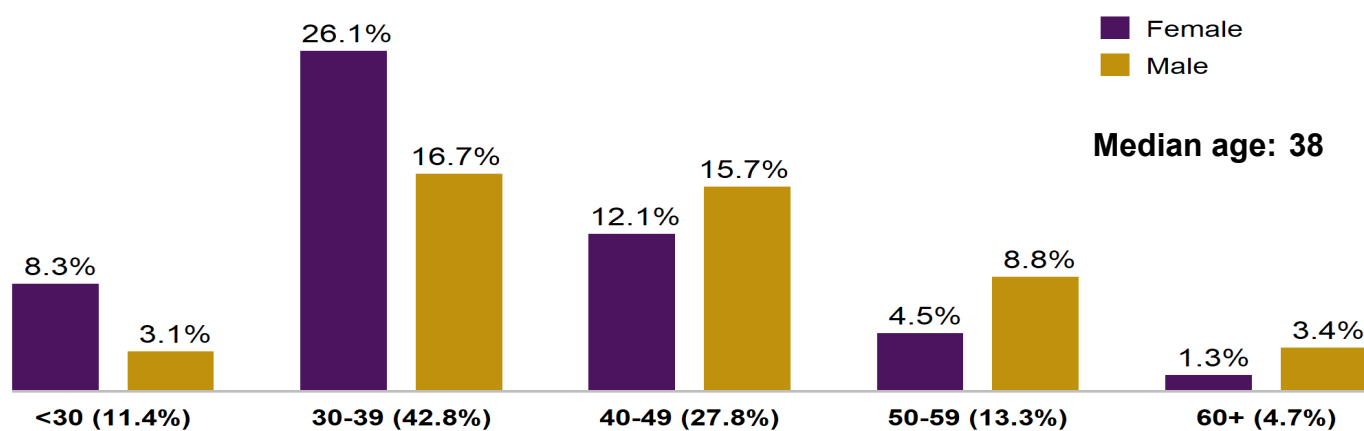

Distribution of Certified Orthopaedic Surgery PAs by Gender and Age

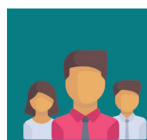

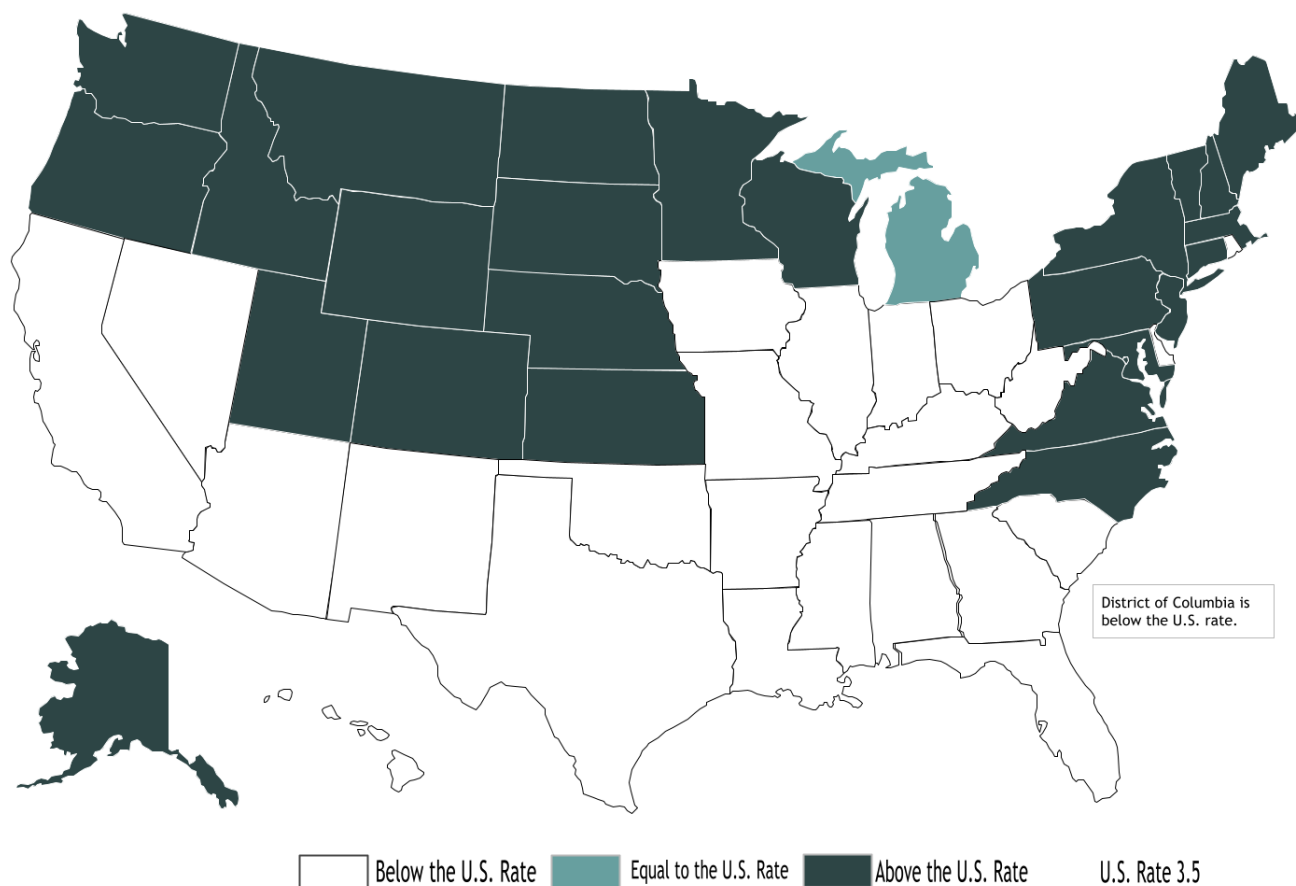

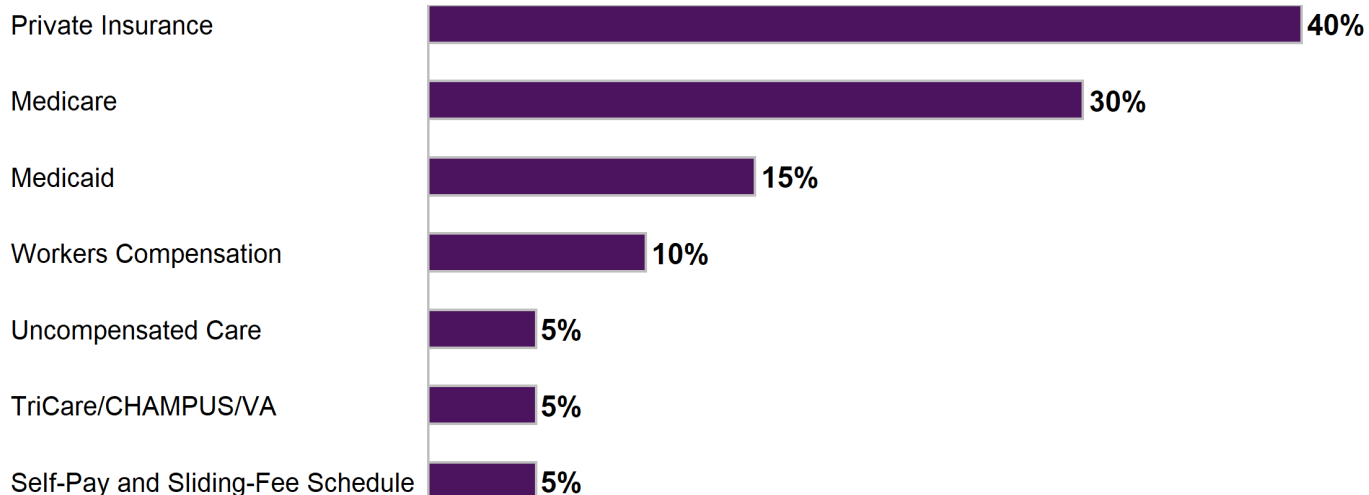

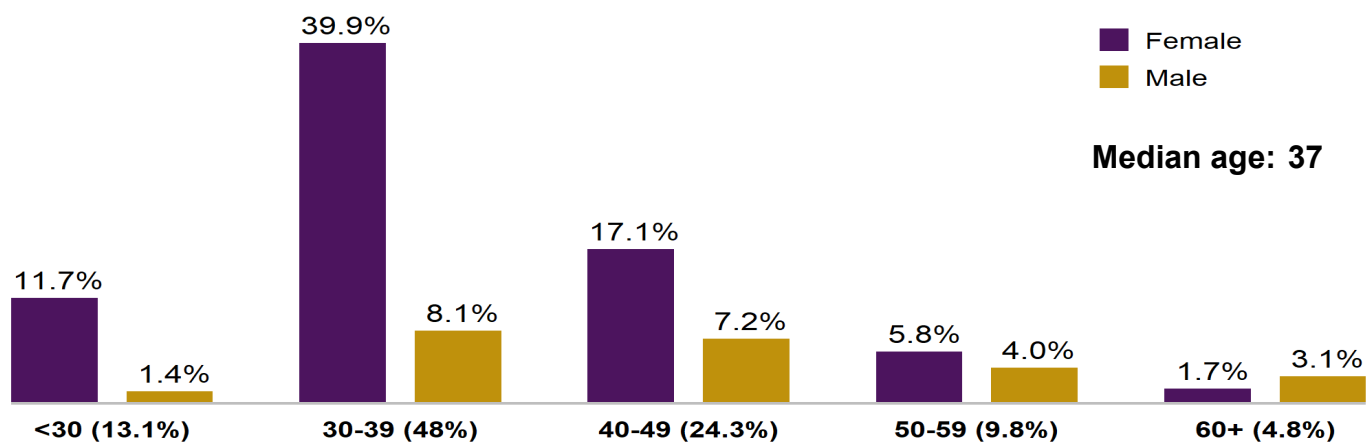

Distribution of Certified Otolaryngology PAs by Gender and Age

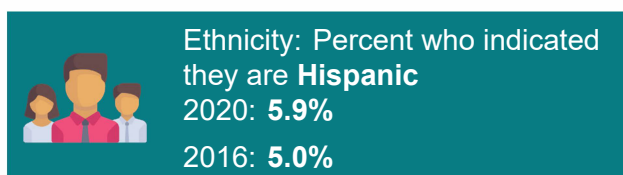

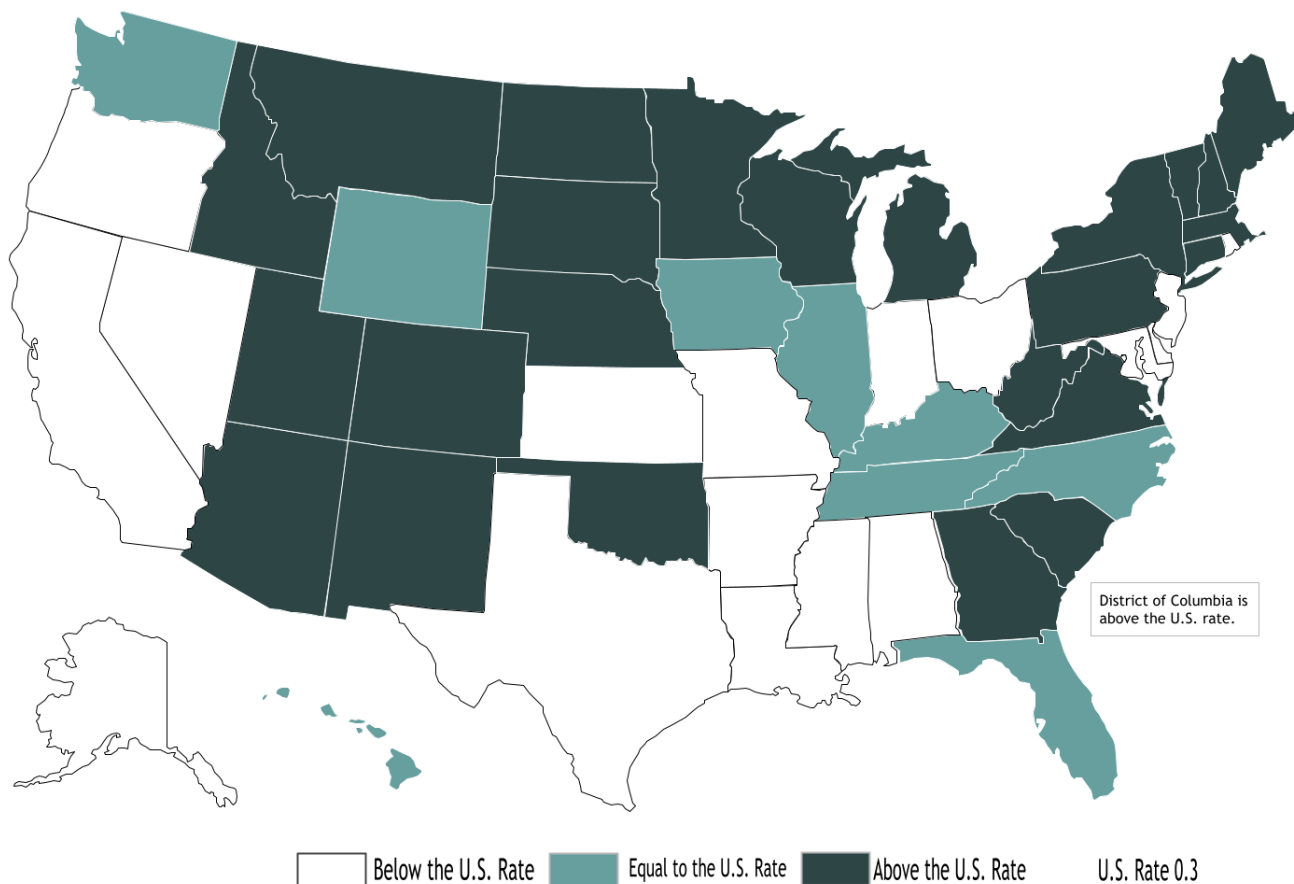

Distribution of Certified Pain Medicine PAs by Gender and Age

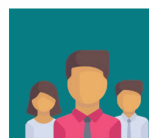

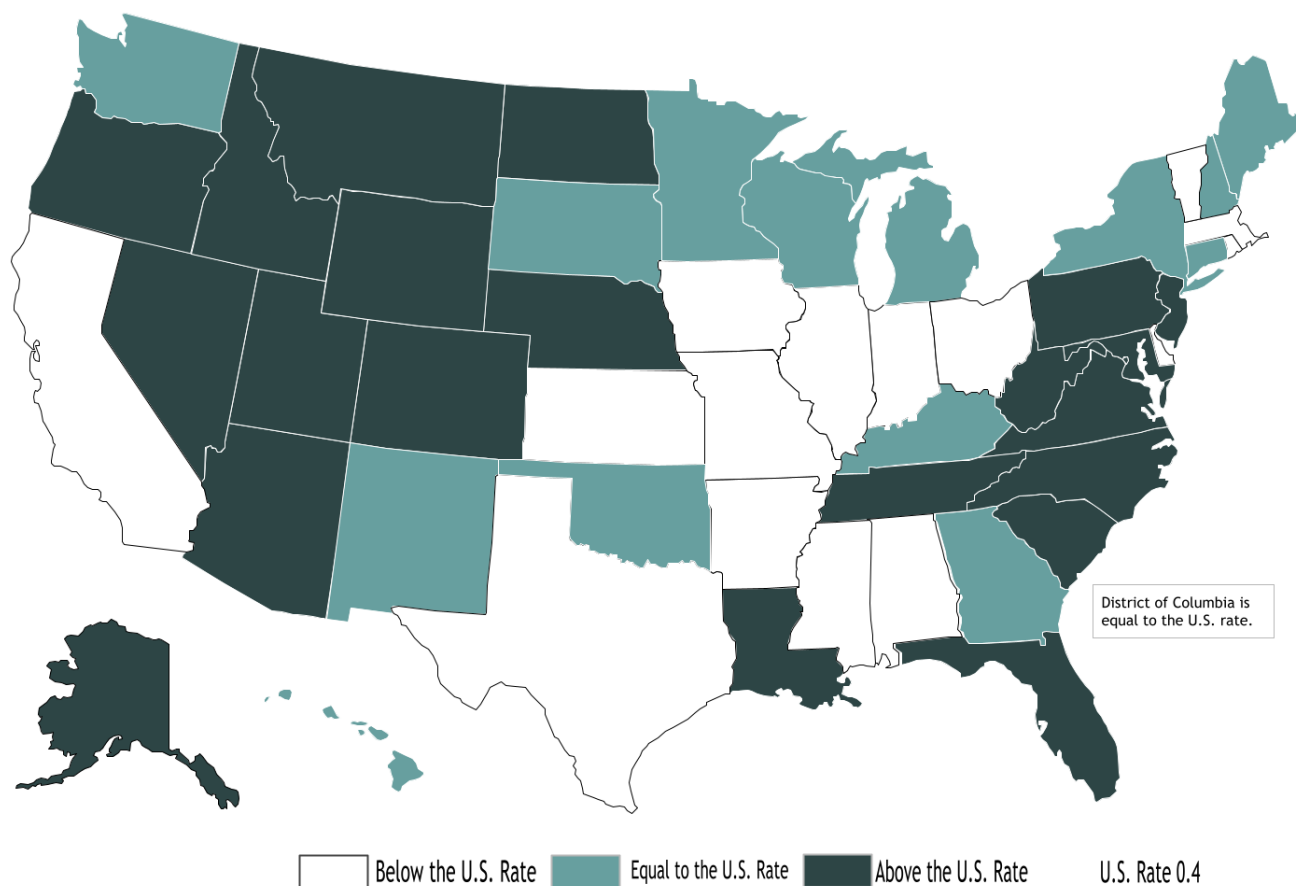

Distribution of Certified Pediatrics - General PAs by Gender and Age

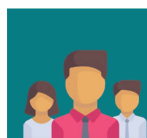

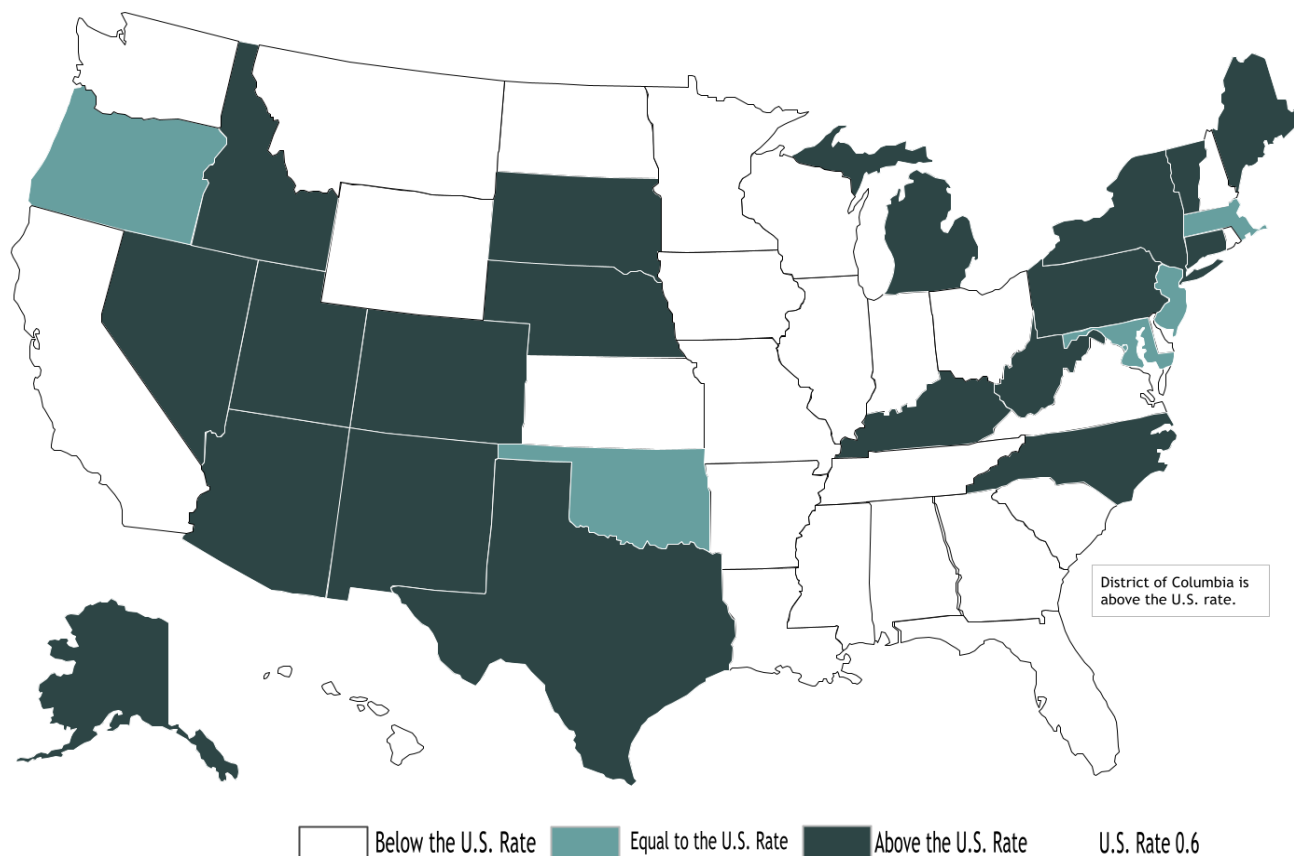

Distribution of Certified Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation PAs by Gender and Age

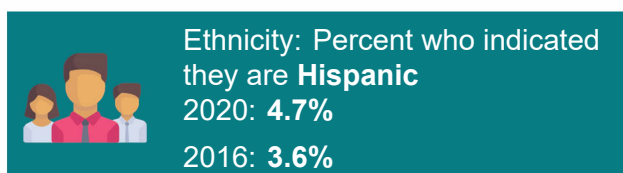

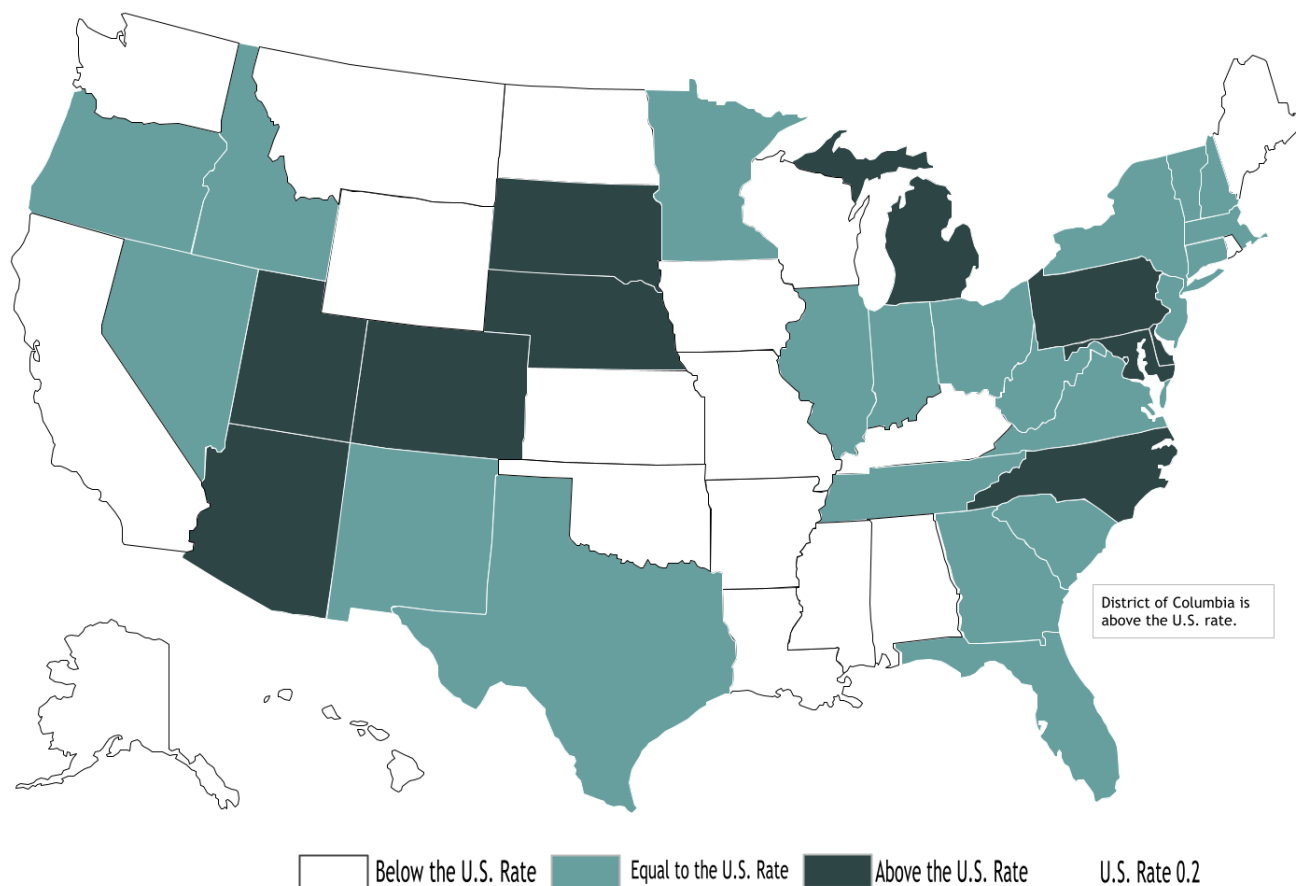

Distribution of Certified Cardiology PAs by Gender and Age

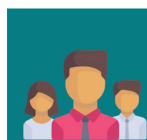

Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

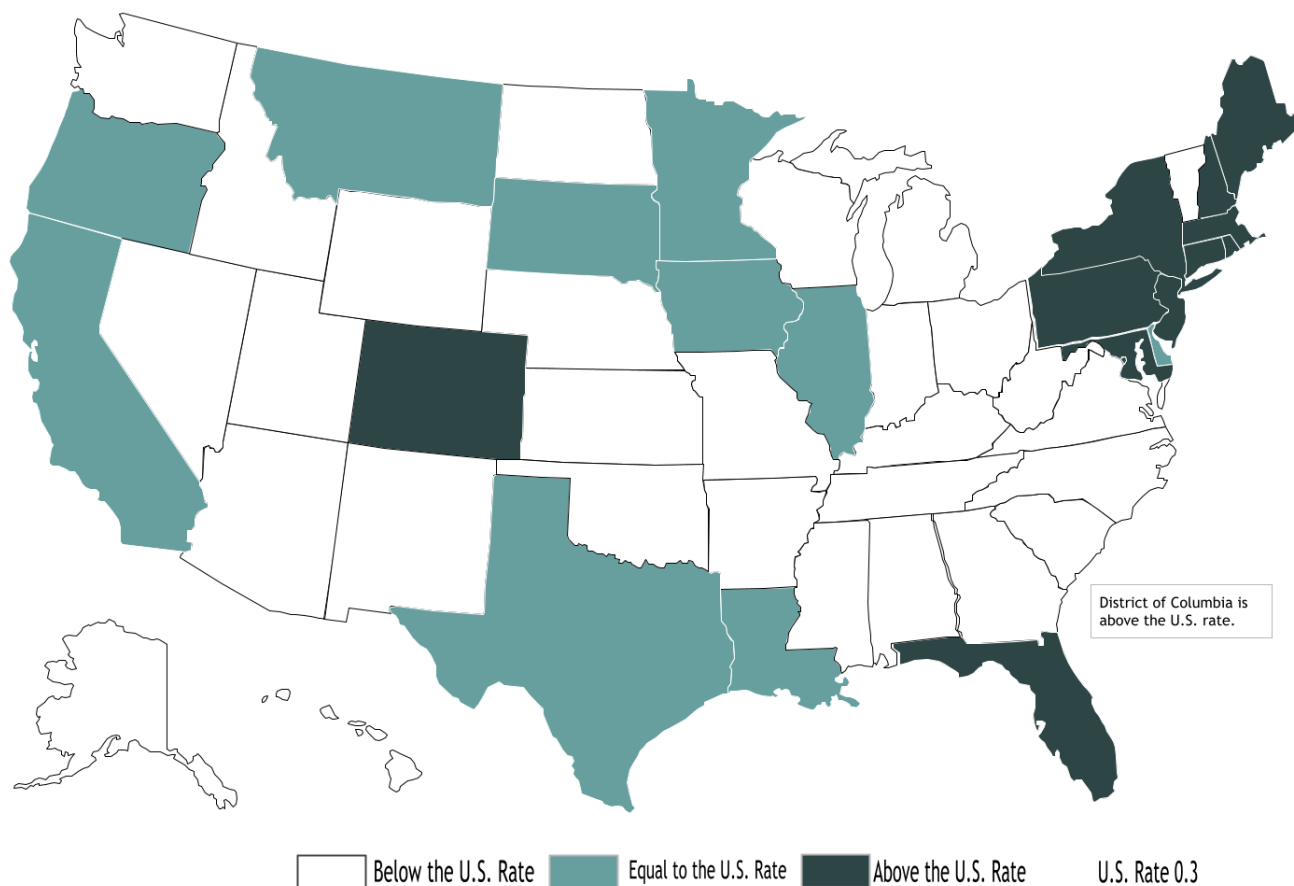

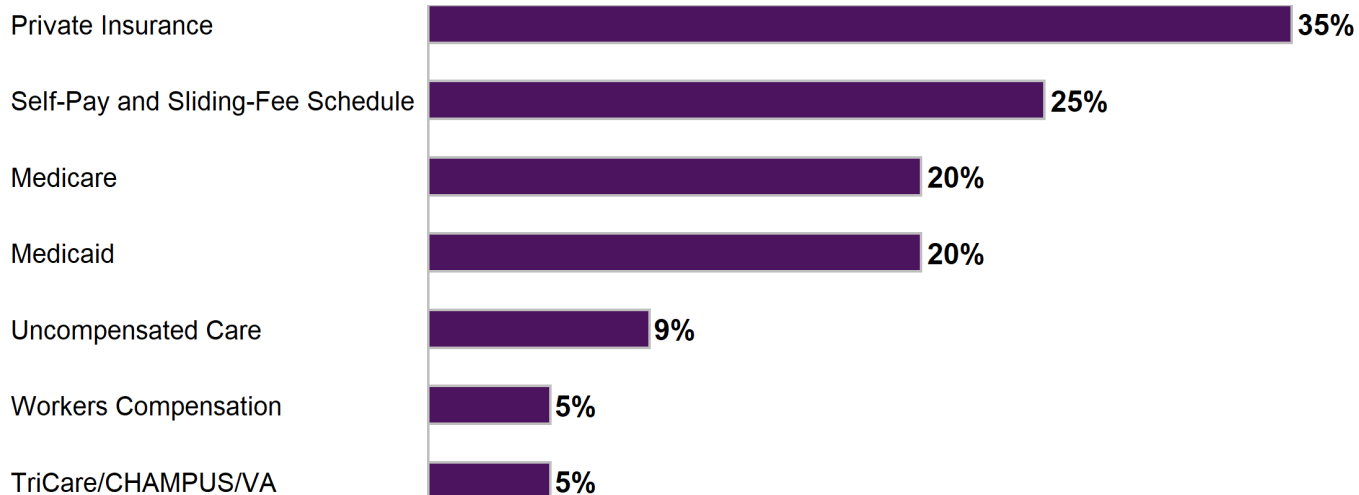

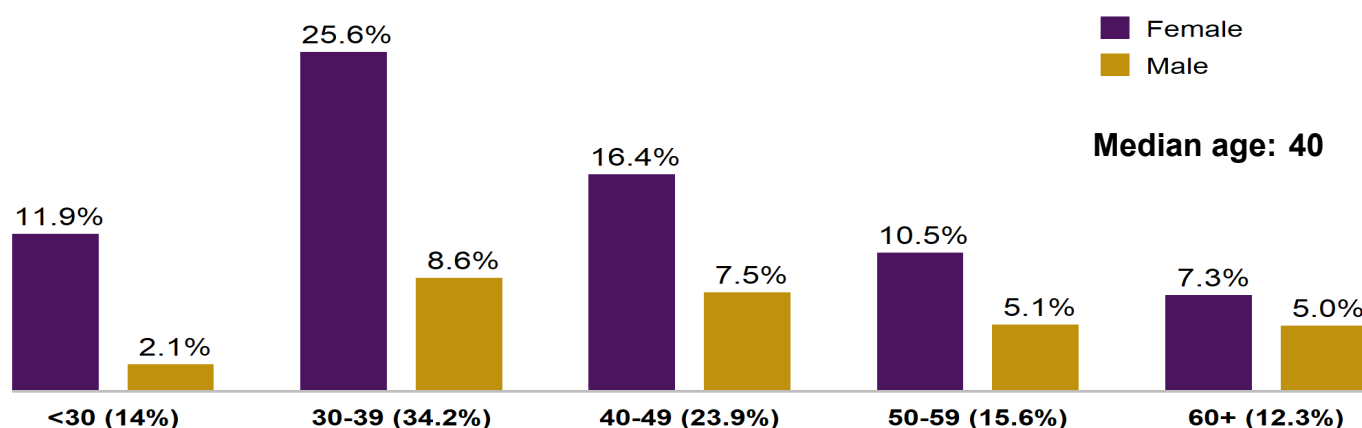

Distribution of Certified Psychiatry PAs by Gender and Age

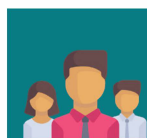

Percentage of Certified PAs by Gender

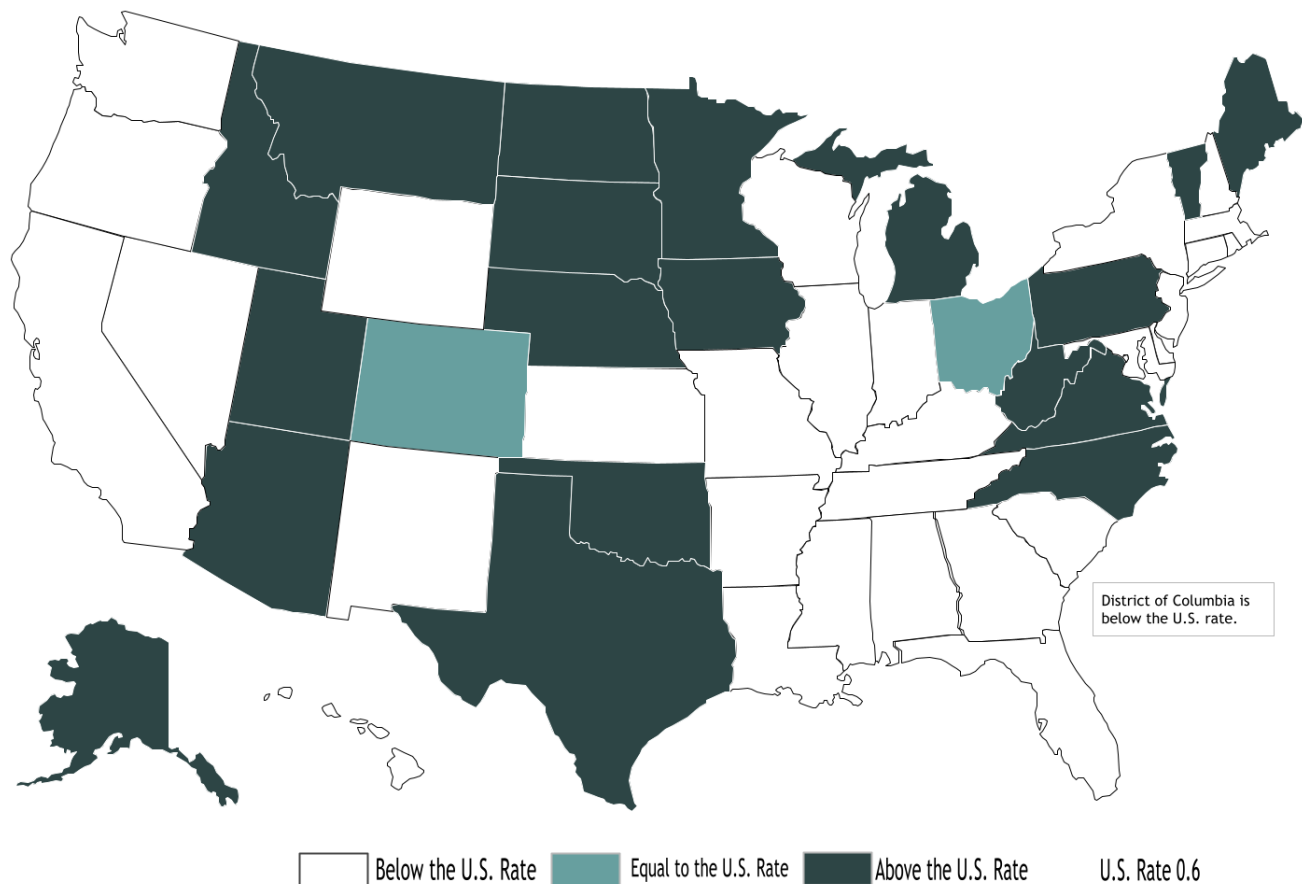

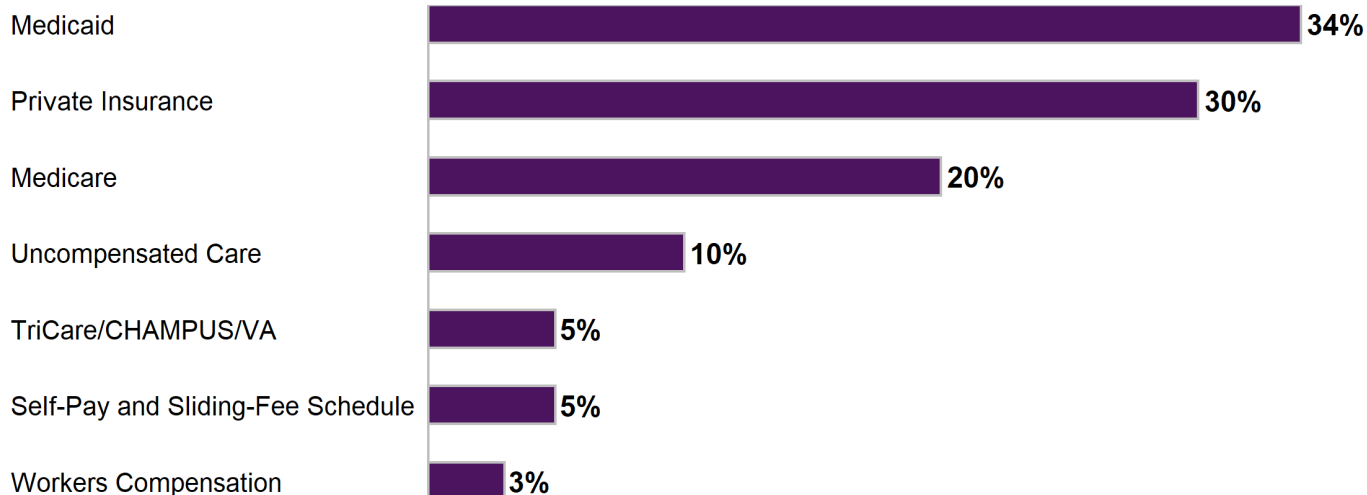

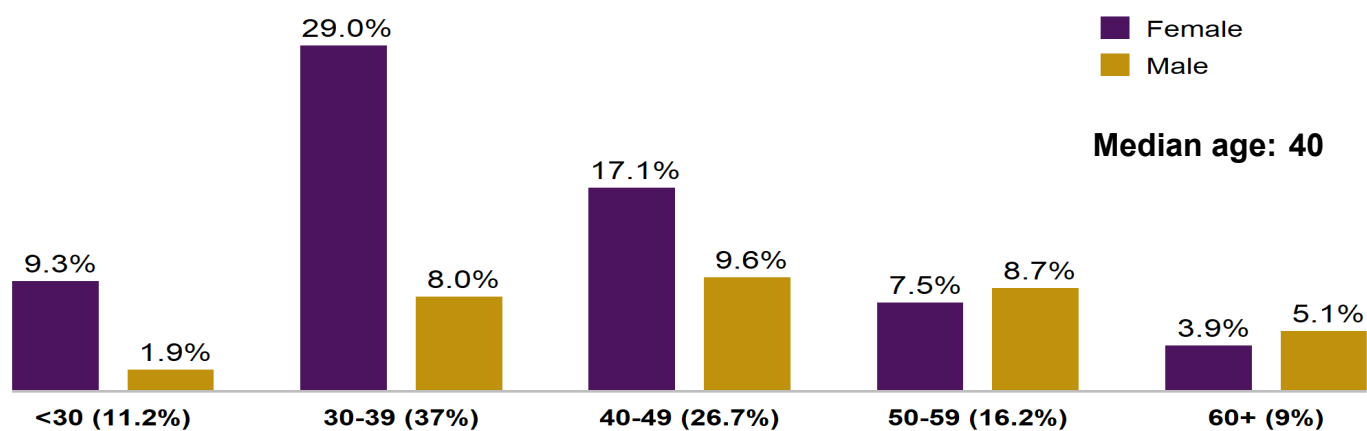

Distribution of Certified Urology PAs by Gender and Age

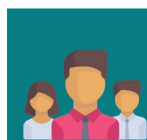

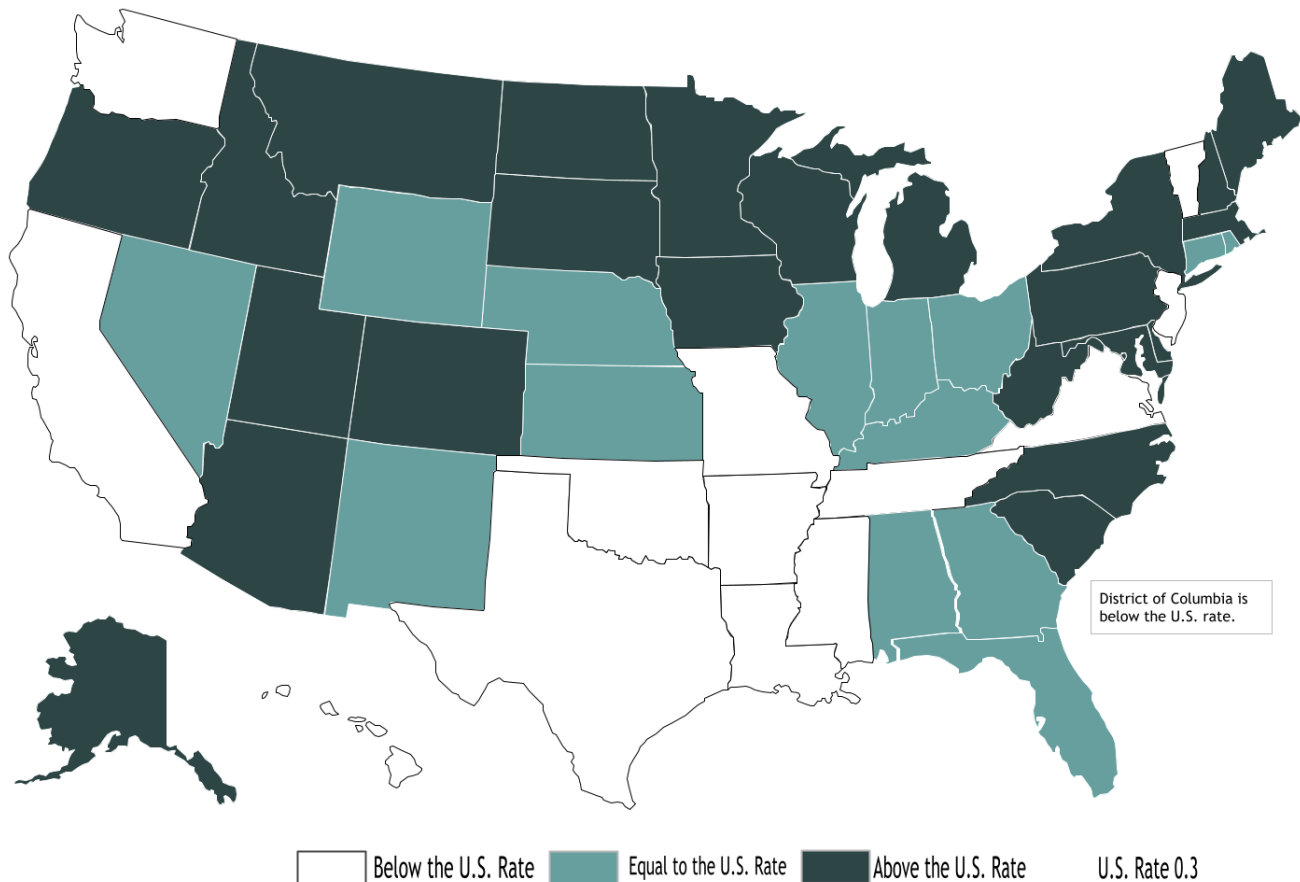

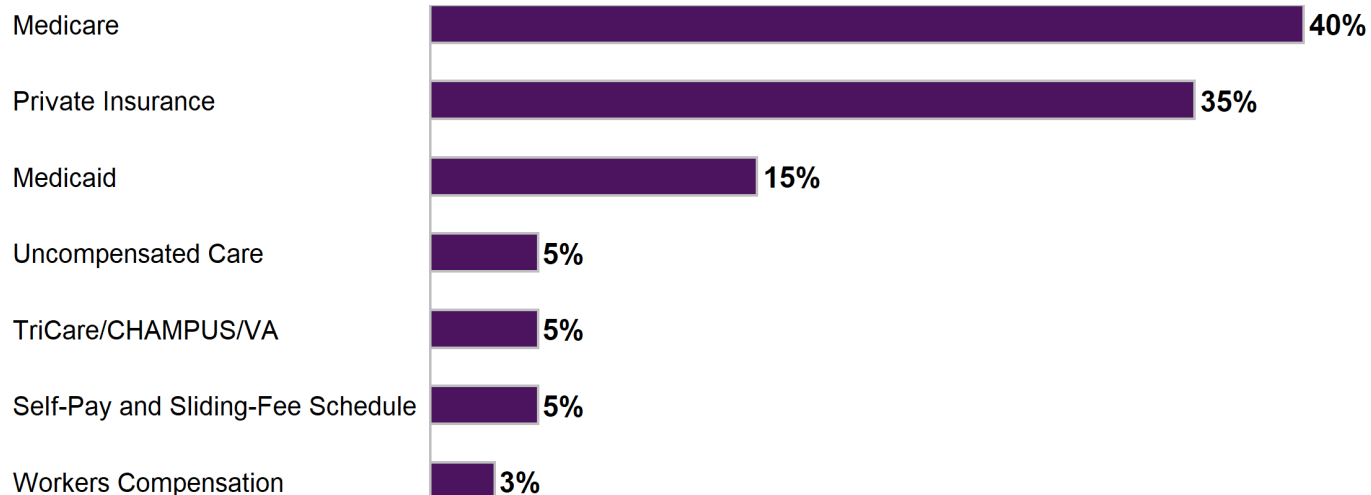

Distribution of All Certified PAs by Gender and Age

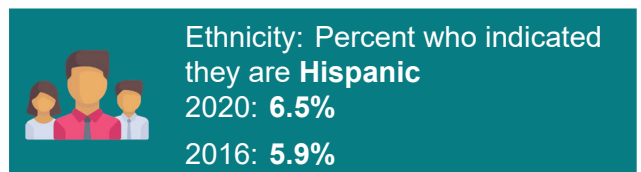

Level of Burnout

Certified PAs were asked to rate their level of burnout based on their own definition of burnout.

Burnout Scale^{1,2}

1= I enjoy my work; I have no symptoms of burnout

2= Occasionally I am under stress, and I don't always have as much energy as I once did, but I don't feel burned out.

3= I am definitely burning out and have one or more symptoms of burnout, such as physical and emotional exhaustion.

4= The symptoms of burnout that I'm experiencing won't go away. I think about frustration at work a lot.

5= I feel completely burnout out and often wonder if I can go on. I am at the point where I may need some changes or may need to seek some sort of help.

The mean burnout score was **2.2** and the median was **2.0**.
